You know, what's interesting is that the number of AIDS cases that are affecting our younger populations, you know, one of the comments that I recall from from one of the shows is that, for that, from that show, is that our younger generation, they had all the information out there, but the numbers are still on the rise

it we have discussed that at some of the men's gathering meetings, and it's most definitely

reflective of and self esteem, self worth, and validation issue, there's some emotional and spiritual elements that are going on, um, that we have not addressed, we have all of the information, all of the clinical information, but we haven't, um, looked at, again, some of the emotional spiritual elements that that caused us to, to put our lives in other people's hands. So we're definitely going to look at that in 2006.

And continue to look at it, you know, and years to come. Some of the some of the some of the ads and some of the comments that were taking, one thing I remember coming across of online was crisis in the black community. And what you talked about the impact of HIV in the African American community through June 2001, the cumulative number of AIDS cases reported to the CDC was 793,026, among black, so you know, those numbers are just increasing, by all means, when we look at the age representation, you know, anywhere from 18, to 20, to 2122. I mean, the numbers, the gap is just very young these days. When you look at self worth, you think, Well, how do you think that plays, definitely

plays a part, if if you're willing to engage in sexual intercourse with someone without protection, and without asking them their HIV status, it definitely speaks to how much you value yourself I, during a seminar, I asked people, if they could name the last five people that they were with sexually within the first 30 days of meeting them. And those five people or some people have less, but of those five people, which which person would you allow to use your toothbrush within that same 30 day period? And most people 99% of the people polled will say, Oh, well, you know, I would never let him or her use my toothbrush, but you let them use your body. And so it's kind of like you hold your toothbrush in higher regard than you do your body. So it's some, some people don't like the analysis, but it certainly speaks to how we, In what regard we hold our sexuality, our body do, do we treasure it? Do we respect it? And and a lot of times, if you look at the HIV, right, actually, we don't because we're taking, we're taking a life threatening chance. That's right. And a lot of us are losing.

That's right. That's right. Actually, this topic was so important. I ended up bringing it back in June 2005, as well, to talk about some additional initiatives that have taken place here in Houston. You know, when you look at some of the some of the comments that have been said, over the years, as far as why is it that some populations are not getting this information? Some of the comments were well, because some of the ads and some of the commercials don't look like us. So what you found was that the initiative started to cater to having more African Americans on the radio, more African Americans and print billboards, things of that nature. So you know, it's kind of like, you know, you tell us why you think you know, you're not getting this information. Okay, fine, we're gonna come up with something to combat that. And sure enough, that's what we're starting to see. Houston has an initiative here where they were able to kind of go out and get all ages, males, females to participate in some of those print ads. So actually, as you ride down the street now, you'll probably see some of those billboards, and they are in prominent African American areas. So Dana Gray has been instrumental in that.

We also need to look at implementing mentorship within the black community, you have a lot of young, black K gays and lesbians who are not, who don't have a role model. They're all you know, 2122 running in the same pack and There's no guidance for them, there's no one there who can mentor them and give them some of the information, just some of the street knowledge or street wisdom that that they would need in order to navigate in this lifestyle.

D Dionne Redman 30:15

Even when I look at some of the new ads that are out there, okay, yeah, they do incorporate faces from the lesbian community faces from the gay black community, you know, so that's a good thing, you know, so even if you're able to, you know, hook up with some type of agency that offers that mentoring, that's a positive was that down the road? Watkins foundation is still doing little programs. Okay. So yeah, to that and find it excellent, you know, mentoring, or at least just a good good source in terms of getting getting tested. When you look at some of our stars that are out there, some of our name brand companies that are out there, Kenneth Cole actually just just started a campaign of T shirts, and on the t shirt, it has we all have AIDS, or we have AIDS, and you can order that online, I think it's like maybe \$15. And I just remember seeing it in one of the magazine. So we have AIDS or I have AIDS, you know, something like that, you gotta get something that's going to come across as powerful. Exactly, you know, so that wouldn't necessarily make one feel comfortable to read a shirt. If somebody I'm looking at like, Oh, he's Hi, I have AIDS. One. Yeah, you know, but that's a wake up call, you know, you got to do such drastic types, you know, to get the attention. So that was fed was really good. One could probably go on Kenneth Cole, just type in Kenneth Cole as a as a search mechanism. And then see if you could pull up that information, or go to we have aids.com or I think is I have a stock calm, I guess I'd be more specific. But like I said, that was such a topic, powerful topic that we brought that back for both January and June. Just in case, we didn't know there existed HIV State of Emergency Task Force. One of our guests at that time, Amber David, who works for St. John's Church, he was on on on the show that day, and really brought brought forth some new initiatives, and also upcoming events, a couple of times a year, you may hear, take a loved one to the doctor, exactly, you've participated in one of those or No, I did eye to eye to. So those kinds of initiatives are more of a hey, help you Brother, help your sister, you know. So those are things that the State of Emergency Task Force looks forward to doing. They also aid in in finding housing for those affected with HIV. We're looking at metal getting medical assistance. Thomas street tends to be Thomas Street Clinic tends to be an advocate of resource, assisting with counseling assisting with Financials, I don't think we really would have any idea what it would look like for one to be discriminated against, to if they you know, to know if someone had HIV. You know, that's one of the things that you know, a medical profession, still have stigma and some negative myths or negative attitudes toward that population.

Well, we in the black community, we still have a stigma and sexuality is still taboo. So we're certainly fighting a an enormous battle. We're trying to get over just the taboo of sexuality within the strike community. So it is enormous. It's a huge battle. And everybody actually has

Not exclusive, like many of the black churches are impersonal, Jeffrey Campbell, made a great point when he said a lot of black churches only tolerate gay, they're gay and lesbian members, and that he had big he had grown tired, as we all should have, of just being tolerated, you want to be affirmed and loved. As long as you're singing in the choir and usher in and cooking pies and cakes and stuff, then you're fine.
