Number one is I need a pen pal who is gay, and who would not mind writing someone in prison? I will enclose My name inmate number and address in this letter. Number two is I have no gay literature available to me and don't have access to any. Mainly I don't have any addresses to write for free publications such as the voice triangle and the twit. I know these three publications are free. So could you provide me with their addresses? Now I can do that. But I don't know that the prison system allows any of those. Any of those publications in the system?
