Okay. I guess go back starting over for what I've seen. I'm not going to give too many details. But we had a pretty disturbing incident that happened to actually members of all good today, at a fundraiser that we were attending. I'm not going to give the exact details because I think it needs to be addressed through the proper means, which is discrimination free zone project that all good and the caucus, the Houston galenson Political Caucus are doing jointly. But to give a brief review or synopsis of what happened. There was a fundraising carwash at a certain

location today, which wound up wound up being cancelled because of utility problems, the water was not working at the location where we're gonna have to carwash. So several members of the group who were there to help the carwash just we were just standing outside, basically debating where we're gonna go to have lunch. The owner of the property, a female, a white female, came to us, the six to five of us who were standing outside, and her exact words where I do not want y'all hanging around my property. And, of course, we were stunned. And we looked at her like, what did she just say, and in the most rude fashion that she can possibly be, she didn't informed Ken here to pick his quote, unquote, junk off of her ground. And she told us to get off. We decided to walk away, and we just happened to bump into her again at Walgreens. And I decided that I wanted to find out exactly where she was coming from. So I approached her, and I said, Excuse me, but I just wanted to let you know that the tone that you came across to us was very racist. And it was also very offensive to, you know, the five people that you addressed, and I just wanted to know where you're coming from. And she goes, Yes, I know exactly what I said. And I just don't want y'all there. And you don't ever have to come back. to So, you know, of course, I can hardly talk about it. Even at this point, it's been several hours without just being extremely, extremely, extremely upset about it. This is something that that I have been talking to several people about, of all different races, that you know, of all places in this world where there should not be any racism, it should be in the gay and lesbian community. How can people who are being oppressed, oppressed people within that same sub population ignorance, and that's one of the goals of all gum is not only to address the homophobia that we face as black Americans, but also to address the racism that we face as black gays and lesbians. Two out of the three times that I have ever been called a nigger in my entire life, it has been by gay white men. Yep. Well, so it's just something that I
