But if we allow them to silence the voice of the artists, they have silenced the Voice of America. This is Kathleen Turner. Please join me in fighting back. Call or write to your member of Congress today. urge them to support the National Endowment for the Arts. Let them know that freedom for the arts is freedom for everyone.
