I want to give begin with a shout out to Randy we're down there in Beaumont, the Tony up there and Midway to John here in the Montrose, Larry here in the Montrose and to all of our other listeners in the far flung reaches of the Lone Star State. Want to start off with a little bit of good news tonight, folks. In a historic vote on Wednesday, the United States House of Representatives voted in favor of the hate crimes legislation, echoing the Senate June sentiment. In June, the United States Senate voted in favor of the hate crimes bill. And now this past Wednesday, the House of Representatives voted in favor of the hate crimes legislation. And the move represents the first time both the House and the Senate voted in favor of comprehensive hate crime legislation and clears the way for hate crime bill to be enacted by the end of the year. And President Clinton praise senators on both sides of the political aisle before the House vote for passing their version of the bill last June saying this is not a bipartisan issue. It's not it's just not true that hate crimes are like every other crime. It is not true that every crime is a hate crime. And that is at the very heart of this debate. Mr. Clinton, the President also had the Wyoming police investigator, David O'Malley, who worked on the 1998 slaying of the gay college student, Matthew Shepard, and that investigator said that Matthew gave up his wallet after one hit one time. Robbery, as a motive was clearly exhausted fairly early on. Hatred was the motive. And it brings to mind how other acts of hatred, not just against gay people, but against, for instance, black, I can think of four little black girls in a church in Birmingham, Alabama, who lost their lives, from bombing because of hate. It was not done out of robbery or something else. It was done purely out of hate. And going along with

Although most contain restrictions in areas like adoption, and that are not placed on married heterosexuals, Denmark, Iceland, Norway and Sweden currently offer registered partnerships, while Hungary and Canada have extended common law marriage to recognize gays. Now, the part where this

is going to be interesting is the fact that we have the Netherlands now who is a member of the European community, the European Common Market, who has now extended this benefit, which means that people throughout Europe can go to the islands and have their ceremony recognized as a full legitimate marriage. And because I think they're rules on recognizing those sorts of days documentation is a lot stronger than our constitutional amendment.
