The assailant attacked a 42 year old woman as it's reported in the voice, who suffered a broken jaw, a 34 year old woman came to her aid, trying to prevent further injury. And then she too was injured as the attacker tried to run over her in his escape. Whoa, the attack was motivated by hate because the woman was perceived to be a lesbian. And the attacker vector uttered as the as the paper put it derogatory and prejudicial remarks about lesbians prior to his attack, and then they also as they report, the attack was completely without provocation. They're also asking for some help in this particular matter. If you if you know anything about this particular attack, this thing that happened, look up this article in the voice, there's a phone number there to call of a law office. And of course, also you can call the hate crimes hotline. Oh,

Some in the local gay community believe that the women were slain because of their efforts to help defeat a statewide anti gay rights measure up there in Medford, Oregon. However, police say that no hard evidence indicating a hate crime was found. What does that mean? Well, it means that they were shot and nobody knows why. Right? Nobody knows why there. There wasn't anything. Yeah, they weren't carved up. There's nothing painted on their truck. Yeah. It sometimes that's a difficult call to make whether it's a hate crime or not. Sure.
