I know two males went into the women's restroom, the commandant said and something we considered inappropriate. They had been warned and basically told us not to do that. I told not to do that said Elmer Schneider chief of University Police Department. Did we

want to arrest them? No. We were almost forced into it because we had warned them to me in this case it was something of their own choosing. Vic said Vic's who, who said she was never warned not to shower in the women's bathroom remain an isolation of the Brazos county jail on Thursday evening. She's being held on a \$6,000 bond for criminal trespass a Class B misdemeanor, makes his juvenile cousin has been since released from custody returned to read arena and reunited with your 18 year old sister who is also staying there. I don't think I should be in here Vic's said during the brief collect telephone call from jail. It's foolish. This has nothing to be in jail for I live like this. This is my life. Right now I'm just scared. I've been here since Sunday, and they haven't told me anything. I've never been in jail before. I'm just not used to this. According to Vic's who said she worked as a substitute teacher at a middle school in New Orleans. She had never before encountered a problem when using women's bathrooms. She said she wanted to shower in the women's facility because she felt safer and more comfortable doing so. It says he did not request special accommodations. But she did speak to the female volunteer and explained her situation. Police and shelter officials say they were unaware of any such conversation.
