Early into the investigation, the San Diego Union Tribune quoted a navy official was saying that he had taken part in homosexual acts with several men on the Baylor wood, prompting speculation that the murder was the result of a lover's quarrel. But friends of Schindler's strongly reject this allegation. And the sailor who statement suggested that helped me with Schindler's lover has failed to lie detector test, and it since recanted his testimony. So there was one of five gay sailors on the baylor wood, Richard Eastman was one of the gay sailors and says that he too experienced harassment,

I think they were the first Liberation Organization, so called in the third world to take that stance. And there have been a lot of lobbying by both black and white gays and lesbians. You

report notes an all time high in violence against gays and lesbians and five cities with Portland, Oregon having the most number of attacks on record. Martin he Raga is author of the report. We asked he raga if the rise wasn't perhaps a result of better tracking and reporting methods and a heightened consciousness

Yes, there is a greater consciousness for reporting anti gay hate crimes. But we're looking at a five year longitudinal study in which violence has risen 172% against lesbians and gay men. And clearly, violence is so widespread and prevalent, that just the simple knowledge about reporting hate crimes cannot be the sole accounting for that.

There's some concern that because President Clinton has at least attempted to make good and some of his campaign promises to gays that he may in fact himself become a target of violence. What's the basis of that concern, Martin?

One of the reasons we know about this targeting is because of calls made to the offices of the national march on Washington for lesbian, gay and bisexual liberation and equal rights members. of the white area in resistance, threatened the life of the president because of his support for lesbians and gay men and supporters of the lesbian and gay community are also targeted for anti gay and lesbian violence. And that's something that's really important to remember.
