after the show, like many people always do and say, how do you become a comedian? And we said, well, you know, it's a simple thing, but you just have to do it. So two years later, this was last month, when they had the funniest person in Houston contests have laughed off, Frank entered the contest and won the preliminary round and went to the went to the finals. He didn't win in the finals. But he told we didn't know who he was at first. And then he told us this afterwards that he approached us a couple years ago, we thought it was very funny. And this was even before that, we knew that and asked him if he would open for us. So he's a real medical doctor here in Houston. He's gay, he's out. And don't like to brag, but we're just getting so successful. We have our own medical doctor traveling with how the gay Comedy Jam got started. Well, the gay comedy exam started our first show was February of 94. At the last stop, and we were both comedians on the road, I had just recently left my corporate job, which Jim mentioned earlier, oh, yeah, for a major oil and gas company whose name I won't mention, but it sounds like Conoco was, hey, we were just, I was trying to establish my career. And Scott had already really established his career, he'd already been doing comedy for two or three years. That first show here in Houston, of course, sold out weeks before it was even scheduled, we had to add another second show that had sold out and we thought, well, maybe this is something that people want to see, you know, and we, our manager started working with it on the road. And you know, since then we've been to over 100 cities, and we're keeps on growing over 100 cities. Yeah. Oh, definitely. We can't complain. Hi, I want to go on the road with them. Yeah, well, it's not as glamorous as you might think, you know, it has its ups and downs. But it's like everything else. So we have a great time. You know, we're so I'm so lucky. I don't mean to sound like Suzy homemaker. But now I've got somebody who loves me very much able to spend time with him, although we do get on each other's nerves occasionally, but and it's just a wonderful thing. It really is. And, of course, Scott, as you know, recently, I publicly announced the fact that I was HIV positive, and had full blown AIDS. And that was a big decision for me to make, it was something that I struggled with a long time, just the public, you know, what the public would really interpret that as not so much in the gay and lesbian community, but in mainstream.
