And now, I have been a health care professional, and I know how funding works, and pure funding. When you're when you're talking about pure research funding, AIDS is still lagging behind the cancer and the heart disease. We're looking at less than \$300 million dollars that goes into pure, pure research. And and it's a travesty that people are scaling these numbers, and unfortunately, they're mostly Republicans. You know, and I think the Molly Irvin's thing was right the other day when she said that the Republicans are going to be, you know, an ADA, they use the fear of black men, and in 92, they're going to use the fear of homosexuals and Hades to try to win the White House. And this is such a, you know, this does a disservice to this nation, not to us as a community, but to this nation as a whole. And Mr. Goodner, is in a position of public visibility and responsibility, and that he would openly attack any group of people, not to mention a group of people who are not well, physically, you know, to me, I, I don't I don't think that if there is a power on the other side, that that he will be getting the positive result of whatever his life experiences brought him. manageable and non life threatening, so that they can have the cash cow patient in that room, generating their billions and billions of dollars. And this kind of thing is what really led me out of the health care profession. Because of this, in itself. Thank you for giving me the chance to say what I thought was important and needed to be sad.

We heard this in like 1982 1983 that people were HIV negative. Actually, they got the test. And when 8484 was the first time they had an HTLV three tests, so 1984 Let's say we found out that people were having diseases known to be aids diseases, or are age related complexes, such as PCP pneumonia, Kaposi sarcoma, definitely that that was that was the most common denominator in many cases that people did not turn up HIV positive. There's two or three different aids antibodies if I'm if I'm correct, I'm not a professional. So don't quote me on this. But basically, there's two or

three different antibodies will show up on the HIV test to get now and this is happening this in this article it says the Centers for Disease Control is called the meeting next month to discuss the discovery of an AIDS like illness in patients who don't have HIV official said Thursday. It says the CDC has known about five cases since 1989, but did not disclose the information because officials didn't believe the illness was widespread or threat, said Dr. James Curran, CDCs, Deputy Director for AIDS, and additional 21 cases came to light at the International Conference on AIDS in Amsterdam earlier this month. It goes on to talk about this. And it says the 26 million patients all have very low numbers of the body's master immune cells, white blood cells called CD fours. Basically, once again, the gay community has known about this for quite some time we rallied we've tried to get protests and we protest we've tried to get funding. And since it didn't turn up under the auspices of HIV, we've been ignored. Since stripe, people weren't willing to say I have AIDS when AIDS was known as a gay disease. And straight people were dying from things like Kaposi sarcoma, and things like that. Then nobody was willing to step forward and say, you know, gosh, this might be aids because they're straight. Only now, in 1992 is somebody willing to step forward and say, I'm a straight person and I have AIDS. So I'm willing to put in money that this has been very widespread, very common, and people have been dying undiagnosed for many a long time just like lesbians with AIDS.
