news wrap a summary of some of the news in or affecting the lesbian and gay community for the week ending April 11 1992. Law red lesbian homosexuality, Latinas, Latinos and America el Caribe. Literally, the network of lesbian and gay Latinos in America and the Caribbean, was born late last month as representatives from Central and North America met in Managua, Nicaragua. The three day meeting resulted from the world conference held in Mexico in 1991. By ILGA, the International lesbian and gay Association, they began planning for the first congress of Latino lesbians and gays in the Americas to be held in November 1993. In Brazil,

gay activists from Turkish Kurdistan made their first international appearance as ill they held a conference in Berlin. They reported frequent police raids on gay bars and random arrests and questioning of effeminate men, leading to police registration of the men that they say destroys any possibility of future employment. As a result, many Turkish gay men become transvestite prostitutes, strengthening an association between homosexuality and transvestism in the public mind. Police often beat transvestites, which at least three times has led to intervention by Amnesty International. religious fanatics also attack gays in cruising areas inside the closet. Men often manage to have happy relationships nonetheless,

in Canada, controversial Anglican priest Jim ferry has been defrocked for refusing his bishops order to end his gay relationship. Ferry may fight the decision either in the courts or by filing a job discrimination complaint with the Ontario Human Rights Commission.

Britain's recent crackdown on gay sadomasochism has been affirmed in a court of appeals, which upheld the convictions of five men arrested last year at a party in a private home. The decision is being appealed to the House of Lords. But it could mean that SM between

consenting adults in private, regardless of sexual orientation is illegal under laws against inflicting bodily harm. Two of the men are free on bail to remain in jail, and the fifth has completed his five month sentence and been released.

There's a happy ending after two years of struggle as Norway has granted an English lesbian legal residence to be with her Norwegian partner in giving Anna Rita her permit. The Norwegian Ministry of Justice reversed a decision it made a year ago when its regulations posed the impossible situation of requiring unmarried couples to live together for two years. Even though foreigners could only get two three month visitors permits each year. Now the ministry has recognized that marriage is not an option for same gender couples and declared the permit was granted for the purpose of A union of family.

The Georgia Supreme Court has determined that the state sodomy law does not invalidate a property agreement made by a lesbian couple. Patricia Gildan and Florence Crook began their relationship in 1982 and hired an attorney to help them develop a property agreement. When the couple split up in 1989, Crook refused to honor the agreement and Gildan sued for her share. A trial court declared the contract was void because it would quote, facilitate a relationship which in Georgia is considered illegal and immoral and quote, but the Georgia Supreme court has rejected that argument concluding that the contract and the promises made in it are legal. The Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, the National Center for Lesbian Rights, and the American Civil Liberties Union had all filed friend of the court briefs, arguing that gays and lesbians have the same fundamental rights as other citizens to enter into contracts. Paula Edelbrock of Lambda called the decision a crucial victory, and another big step towards recognizing equal rights for lesbian and gay families.

More recognition for lesbian and gay families came from Democratic US presidential candidate Jerry Brown. In response to a human rights campaign fund questionnaire, Brown became the first major party candidate ever to endorse marriage rights for same gender couples. Democratic front runner Bill Clinton responded with a flat No.

That quote promotes a lifestyle prohibited by Alabama's sodomy and sexual misconduct laws and quote, the bill has already passed the Judiciary Committee and awaits discussion on the floor of the house where it is said to have substantial support.

in Norfolk, Virginia, 100 gays and lesbians demonstrated outside City Hall demanding protection from gay bashing. The protest was stimulated by the case of a 14 year old boy who shot a gay bartender in the back. The boy was the oldest of a group of 10 children, the youngest of them eight years old, who told police they went into the anvil to mess with some gays. Because gay bashing is not covered under Virginia's bias crime laws. The shooter was charged only with malicious wounding and illegal use of a firearm despite serious injury to the bartender.

to US courts recently issued contrasting decisions on discrimination against cross dressers. A Washington State appeals court ruled against aircraft giant Boeing Corporation in favor of Jane Doe, hired as a male in 1978. Doe was diagnosed four years later with gender dysphoria. Doe notified Boeing that he would be living as a woman for a year before undergoing sex change surgery. The company ruled that doe quote was not permitted to wear any clothing that would cause a complaint if she wore it into the men's restroom and quote, When doe wore a pink pearl necklace to work, he was fired. The state appeals court agreed with DOE that this was employment discrimination in violation of the state's protection for people with physical disabilities. Because gender dysphoria is a recognized medical condition. Boeing is appealing.

The US Supreme Court however, let stand a court of military appeals decision against Navy Petty Officer for Helio Guerrero, who after 10 years in the service was given a bad conduct discharge for wearing women's clothing in his own apartment. Although the only people to witness Guerrero in female attire were a visitor in his apartment and two neighbors looking

through his window The Military Court found that Guerrero brought discredit on the service by allowing others to see him cross dress. The US Supreme Court has declined to hear Guerreros appeal.

There's been an interesting decision by a US appeals court against Ernest Dillon, a postal service employee who says he was harassed by coworkers who perceived him to be gay. Since the US Civil Rights Act specifies sex and not sexual orientation.
