Number three, the right to privacy defined as sexual autonomy and control over our sexual and reproductive lives without criminal sanction, or the dictate of government. Number four, the right to family defined in the legalization of gay marriage and gay relationships, the elimination of unfair discrimination against our capacity to be parents. Number five, the right to health care defined as non discriminatory access to care and the receipt of services and a non discriminatory response to health problems disproportionately faced by our people, such as AIDS, breast cancer and other gay health issues. And number six, the right to live in peace as openly gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered people. That to me is, you know, the perfect basic agenda for what we should be working on. And theoretically, the some Log Cabin Republicans like Dale Carpenter, and someone like me, right tall black radical, Michael Crawford can all agree to work on these six issues, right? We can do them when in whatever way works for us. But on the other issues like, like queers, and immigration, you know, I will go on with my progressive agenda.
