You heard it here. First I made, I'm making that prediction. And one thing that we need to get in the habit of doing when we're talking to our friends, our families, the media or whoever about the marriage issue is we need to say marriage and not gay marriage, same gender, marriage, sex marriage, because we're not seeking something that's totally separate from what heterosexual is already had the right to do. What we're seeking is pretty much the same thing, except that it will be primarily a civil ceremony with us.

But basically, what's happened is, some gay couples in Hawaii have gone to court to say, yeah, it's unconstitutional in Hawaii to ban marriages between persons of the same gender. So it's, it's supposed to go to think the Hawaii Supreme Court. In July of '96. And the state, the state of Hawaii has been told they have to show a compelling, not just an ordinary reasoning, but a compelling reason why same sex marriages should not be allowed. What we're expecting is or a lot of queer activist seem to be expecting is that the state will be unable to do that. And marriages will be legalized in Hawaii. Now, what that means is me and my newfound boyfriend, whoever he may be, can fly to Hawaii, get married, come back to the state of Texas, and say to the state of Texas, you have to recognize this as a married couple. And the big fear among a lot of states in the union is that that's exactly what's going to happen. So some states have already tried to legally define marriage as being between a man and a woman, whatever. And now, it's the point when we should be organizing against it. I do know that the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, which is doing an amazing job, not just on the marriage, just but a whole range of issues. The director of their marriage project has been crisscrossing the country, trying to organize people and get them excited about the marriage issue. And one of the things that I'm hoping to do in the near future, ideally with the revitalized coronation, is I

want to organize a freedom to marry roundtable where queer people from queer groups all around the city will be invited to come together to begin to plan strategy for working around the marriage issue. What do we want to do? How do we want to educate people? How do we build up support in our own community? How do we outreach to the straight community and what we can do in terms of legislative efforts?

On November 26, two lesbians were bashed in the Randalls parking lot. Now, I'm not really sure which Randles location it was, and I think the women are doing okay. But, you know, just another attack on lesbian and gay people in an effort to dehumanize us and to frighten us into staying into the closet. And on Wednesday, as we mentioned a little earlier, in part one of the program two Neo Nazis from Montana, stepbrothers well half brothers brothers attacked a gay- a pair of gay men in a in a West Harris County Bar early Thursday, Thursday night, Thursday morning, Wednesday night, and one of the men was stabbed 35 times and left to die in his bed. And the other man was being beaten up before. Patrons of the bar stopped him and the two murderers and you know, we're calling them murderers, not alleged murderers.

But you don't necessarily have to do the same thing. It's just important that you come out of the closet that you talk to your friends, to your parents, your co workers about the fact that you are gay and what it means to be gay and what it means to be gay in a society that does not value homosexuality.
