Or if they do, it's just like one cocktail in like a social thing, which I don't know if that's temporary, because you know, something? Oh, I just drink socially. Is that I mean, where do you draw the line of of having a problem? Is that a problem every six to eight months, you don't get so loaded? Well,

one of the biggest things that you can depend upon is if anybody around you is finding it a problem. Like is your lover finding a problem, or your family or anybody or your job or anybody like that? If nobody thinks it's a problem that you, you don't have any personality changes, nothing happens. But one of the things that happens is no, that's a pretty unusual case where you've got somebody that gets drunk every six to eight months. Usually, you're you'll find a binge drinker might go six months without drinking, and then we'll drink for days on end or something like that. But one of the things that separates an alcoholic from a social drinker is that they will more than not get drink intoxication. And then they'll have

And social drinkers don't like that feeling of being out of control. So normally, they can put down a drink after you know, one or two or three drinks and go home. Whereas an alcoholic even if they can kind of control it for a little while. And that's what's so funny about the word controlling it because if you didn't have a problem with it, how why would you have to control it? So but you can fool yourself into that and manage to go three, four or five months without really getting smashed, but if you I'm drinking and getting loaded and out of control is going to happen eventually. And then I'll happen more and more and more and more as time goes on. So it's it's an inevitability and I and each individual person has to make that determination. But usually, people are gonna say things and even though I was one of those happy drunks, you know, that is easier to get by. I had friends of mine saying, gee, share, and you know, we're just a little concerned about your drinking and that kind of thing. So most of the time, people are gonna say something that are in your life, I didn't have anybody I didn't have any lovers or husbands or anything at the time that I was really at the high peak of, so I didn't have anybody on my back. And so I think I probably, if I had had anybody telling me to get out of the, you know, that I needed to quit, I'd say, Well,
