Thank you, Mr. President, I rise in support of the nomination of Roberta Achterberg. I was pleased to be able to vote for her in the banking committee, and I'm proud that I will have an opportunity to cast the vote in favor of confirming her on the floor. Mr. President, Miss Oxenberg. And President Clinton knows that we are a multicultural, pluralistic society. And they know that the American dream of opportunity is for all of us. And not just some of us. We are African American and Polish Americans and Hispanic Americans and Irish American and Asian Americans and Greek Americans. We are female as well as male, we are gay and lesbian as well as straight. One reason for Bill Clinton's victory was that he recognized that we are all Americans. And he therefore campaigned to bring us together rather than to drive us apart. Mr. President, I am frightened this afternoon because I sat on this floor and listened to the debate.
