Actually, I received three separate emails from wives who discovered that their husbands were cross dressers. And we have not really spent a lot of time on the show talking about about this issue. But obviously, it's an issue that is on the mind of our listeners. And so I want to take the time and go through some of this. Let's start with the basic thing. A person who is is a crossdresser usually has started somewhat early and often is in their early 20s. That's not always the case, I can tell you that I started cross dressing when I was 12 years old. But it was a little different for me because I actually wanted to be a girl crossdressers do not do not want to change their sex, they do not want to change their gender. That's the basic difference between a crossdresser and a transsexual. A transsexual is a person who's unhappy with the body they're in and who wants to take steps to have an altered. Now that can be a number of things. It could be plastic surgery, it could be breast implants, it could range or it could range all the way to a complete sex change. For a crossdresser they the the thrill of it the excitement of it is more to do with the clothing and very little to do with any you actual desire to be a woman. They want to emulate womanhood not be a woman I understand this is that's that's the big difference between a crossdresser and a transsexual. Now for a wife all while I guess I shouldn't, I don't want to generalize quite that much. Let me try this another way. From where the starting with the wedding day, most of what occurs in a marriage has a lot of societal dictates and whims and rules built around it. A wife comes into marriage with certain expectations. And one of those is that the man that she married is going to dress in clothes appropriate to their gender.
