HOST 1: --45%

HOST 4: Big boy.

HOST 1: Guy next door look, 41%. I've never understood that category 'cause I had lived in a house, there was a guy on the right side, a guy on the left side, and they looked nothing alike, so--

[LAUGHTER]

I don't know what the guy next door looks like.

HOST 3: People who shop at the Gap.

JIMMY: I think that's supposed to be like kind of wholesome, nice guy. Yeah, but you know, what if feels like next door to a cholo.

HOST 1: Right?

[LAUGHTER]

The bandana going and stuff. 29% went for the professional look, and 21% were attracted to the rebel look.

HOST 4: Now, what's the difference between the rebel look and the homeboy look?

HOST 1: Oh, and the printer, my printer was off, so the 20% went for the fashion model look, 13% had no preference.

HOST 3: Whatever's available.

HOST 1: That was the ones they surveyed after 2:00 AM.

[LAUGHTER]

HOST 3: Right.

HOST 1: Or at the Rip cord. And 5% went for the good old cowboy look. That's an interesting breakdown of that.

HOST 3: Uh-huh.

HOST 1: What type of body do you prefer? Am I missing something over here?

HOST 3: Live.

HOST 1: --right here.

JIMMY: We do have a caller who has seen the--

HOST 1: Oh, great.

JIMMY: --the play.

HOST 1: Can we hear from them? Or do we save that?

JIMMY: We can if you'll hit the air button, and then hit the yellow button. And people with headphones will be able to hear. Hello? Hit the yellow button till it turns red. Hit it again.

HOST 3: It's not going to work.

HOST 1: Please continue to hold. Your call is important to us.

JIMMY: Oh, we can't-- OK, we'll get some information. If you answer the phone in the lobby, you cannot put them on the air.

MAN: Call back.

JIMMY: OK.

HOST 1: Caller, call back. [LAUGHS]

JIMMY: OK, never mind. I'm sorry.

HOST 1: [SIGHS] Unions.

RADIO STAFF: No.

JIMMY: We have two different phones--

HOST 1: I don't do phones. [LAUGHS]

JIMMY: --just drives me crazy.

HOST 3: Technical difficulties.

HOST 1: No, we only answer shampoo questions here. We have a different conditioner line for you.

[LAUGHTER]

HOST 4: Oh my goodness.

HOST 5: But what if you like the shampoo with the conditioner in it.

HOST 1: That's another line.

JIMMY: Oh.

HOST 1: Was it you that was on line with me with the-- no, it was my other roommate. My computer, we had that problem. We called in. We had a problem, and they were like, oh, that's printers. Oh no, that's like business printers, and so they just everyone had their little special category at Dell.

JIMMY: Air then hit.

HOST 1: Are they back?

RADIO
PERSONNEL: All right, try one more time. He's calling back now.

JIMMY: I know I had him.

HOST 1: Yay.

JIMMY: KPFT *After Hours*, this is Chris. All right, let's see if we can hit the buttons the right time this one.

MAN: Hello?

BRAD: Hello.

HOST 1: Hi, how are you?

HOST 4: Oh, we got him. Finally.

HOST 1: Yay.

HOST 4: Yay.

BRAD: I called four times, and I finally got through.

JIMMY: I'm sorry. I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

HOST 4: We're so glad you came.

[LAUGHTER]

BRAD: Well, I haven't done that yet.

[LAUGHTER]

HOST 3: Who are we speaking with?

BRAD: My name is Brad.

JIMMY: Hi, Brad.

HOST 1: Hi, Brad.

HOST 3: Hi, Brad.

JIMMY: Welcome to *After Hours*.

BRAD: Thank you. I listen to you all the time.

JIMMY: Thank you. Thank you.

HOST 1: Oh, great.

JIMMY: Thank you.

BRAD: Yeah.

JIMMY: So what was this play?

BRAD: It was called *Blade to the Heat*.

JIMMY: Oh, OK.

BRAD: Yeah, and it was over at some theater on the Branch. I don't remember the name of it.

HOST 1: Oh, that's right.

BRAD: Yeah, but it was really, really good. Two Latino boxers, it was set like back in the '40s, sporty kind of time frame, and it's all about their relationship. They fall in love and all those kind of stuff. It was really, really good.

HOST 1: Wow.

BRAD: And I actually met one of the guys who played one of the boxers over at the Westbury Cafe. His name's Ricky. So he was really a nice guy. It was really a good play.

HOST 1: Oh wow.

BRAD: I think--

JIMMY: I'm sorry, I missed it.

BRAD: Yeah.

HOST 1: Yeah, I think it stopped-- I think it ran out already. Didn't it, Brad?

BRAD: It only ran for a couple of weeks. Yeah, but it was really good. It was a great, great play.

JIMMY: Huh, any other plays you've seen?

BRAD: Pardon me?

HOST 1: Any other plays you've seen lately?

BRAD: Well, [LAUGHS] so I'm like the call in like little play critic.

JIMMY: There you go.

[LAUGHTER]

HOST 1: I know Naked Boys Singing! is open again.

JIMMY: Really?

HOST 1: Mhm, a friend of mine is in it.

JIMMY: No kidding.

HOST 1: Mhm.

JIMMY: They had that long run on that.

BRAD: Is he cute?

HOST 4: Is Shawn Carter in it again?

HOST 1: Who?

[LAUGHTER]

BRAD: Over that.

HOST 1: Oh, no, we were--

- OK.

HOST 1: We just started naming off cast members' names--

JIMMY: Yes, well, from the last show, yes. Yeah, let's get a whole new cast. I've already seen their dicks.

HOST 1: Next.

- Ouch.

JIMMY: Ouch, I know. I know. No, no, no, no. No, and so the storyline is that their relationship and that they fall in love and--

BRAD: Yeah, I mean, one of them is in love with the other one. The other one has to come to terms with the fact that the other one is in love with them, and it kind of revolves around that. And it's set in this particular time frame. We're in the '40s and '50s. I mean, of course, these people were not out or anything.

JIMMY: Right, right.

BRAD: And the turmoil that they went through, was dealing with that, it was very interesting. I mean, it was a small venue, but it was put together really well. And the actors did a great job.

JIMMY: Yeah, I've been to that theater over there, and--

BRAD: Yeah.

HOST 1: And I forget what it's called, but--

BRAD: I cannot remember the name of it, but it's on the Branch.

HOST 1: Yeah, it's not Stages because Stages is off Allen Parkway.

JIMMY: Yeah, no, it's-- I can't think--

HOST 1: Ensemble.

JIMMY: Is that it?

HOST 1: I think it's the Ensemble.

HOST 4: The Ensemble Theater, that's it.

BRAD: That's it, yeah.

HOST 4: That's it because I'm remembering the little playbill that we got here for the promotion on it, and it was at the Ensemble Theater. That's it.

JIMMY: OK.

HOST 1: And I guess before we let you go, Brad, Isn't there a play that's benefiting Pride committee that's going to be at Stages-- oh no, sorry-- at Theatre Suburbia coming up.

JIMMY: Theater Suburbia, called *Comfort and Joy*, and it's the performance that benefits the Pride committee and the Gulf Coast Archives and Museum for Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender History, Inc. That's on June the 26th. It's a Wednesday, the Wednesday before the parade.

HOST 1: Again, that's at Oak Forest and 43rd at that intersection so--

JIMMY: Yeah, yeah--

HOST 1: --so go check it out.

JIMMY: --43rd at Ella.

HOST 1: Yeah.

JIMMY: Yeah, right in there.

HOST 1: Yeah, it's like a block away from there.

JIMMY: Yeah.

HOST 1: I think the intersection is Oak Forest. Actually, it's like--

HOST 3: That sounds familiar.

HOST 1: We live like a block away.

- Oh, OK.

HOST 4: Oh, OK.

HOST 1: Yeah.

JIMMY: He can just walk over.

HOST 1: So if y'all want to go, if y'all want to go and pop over for drinks before or after--

JIMMY: Yeah.

HOST 1: --we'll be glad to entertain.

JIMMY: Great, great. Is Brad included in that?

HOST 1: Join us, Brad.

[LAUGHTER]

BRAD: OK.

JIMMY: Thanks for calling in.

BRAD: Thanks.

HOST 1: Thank you, Brad.

BRAD: Buh-bye.

JIMMY: Bye. OK, we also have Chris on line 2 who saw the play.

HOST 1: Chris, how are you?

JIMMY: Wait a minute. I don't have him on line yet. Air, nope. You cut him off. Air first.

HOST 4: Air of two.

CHRIS: Two, yeah.

HOST 4: Two's beeping.

HOST 1: Hello?

CHRIS: Hello.

HOST 1: Chris, how are you?

CHRIS: Hi, I'm fine. The play was fantastic. I have a question for y'all.

CHRIS: You need to turn your radio down. We're getting your feedback.

CHRIS: Oh, I'm sorry--

CHRIS: That's OK.

CHRIS: --about that.

CHRIS: That's OK.

CHRIS: Hey, I just had a question. When did they replace the old rock and roll show with this show? This is the first night I've heard y'all.

CHRIS: We've been on this night, on this station for 15 years.

CHRIS: Oh, oh, Jesus, so sorry, I just moved here.

CHRIS: Honey, it's been a long time since you listened.

HOST 4: Obviously.

CHRIS: Oh goodness. Yes, I'm fairly new to the area.

HOST 1: It's Saturday night.

CHRIS: Oh, OK. OK, no, we've been on the air 15 years in September.

CHRIS: Well, let me ask. Do y'all deal with a lot of homosexual issues and gay and lesbian rights, and things like that?

CHRIS: Absolutely.

HOST 4: Do we ever.

CHRIS: And usually, this show ends up being that sort of, this show ends up being Hispanic slash politics. But I think if you tune in every Thursday-- well, starting next Saturday, Sunday morning actually, from 1:00 to 4:00 PM and 1:00 to 4:00 AM, join us. It's like-- it's a magazine format every Saturday or Sunday morning I should say.

There's two segments. And they have different focuses. But it's always educational.

And we definitely talk about gay and lesbian rights issues.

HOST 2: Yes, we do.

CHRIS: I just moved here from Dayton, Ohio actually recently where there's not a whole lot of homosexual activity. And I was just sort of curious is there a lot of it here in Houston? What kind of places are there to go?

JIMMY: Well, probably, yeah.

HOST 2: You have no idea.

JIMMY: What you need to do is give the switch, Gay and Lesbian Switchboard a call at 713-529-3211 from 6:00 til 10:00 every night, or during the day, during the week. And there are folks there that can tell you what's going on in the community, where the bars are. And I mean, there's just a wealth of-- We've got a whole community here in the Montrose.

HOST 2: What's your interest, Chris?

JIMMY: Chris.

CHRIS: Well, I think that's sort of obvious that-- but let me ask you this. What about swingers? Are there swingers in town too, that kind of stuff?

JIMMY: Sure, yeah.

CHRIS: Really?

JIMMY: Yeah, there--

CHRIS: So this is a-- I mean, this is obviously a big city. It's much bigger than Dayton. I just-- I'm just curious about what's going on.

HOST 2: For general information, you may want to try sidewalk.com.

CHRIS: OK.

HOST 2: And that tells you-- you've got like-- you can put categories of bars and stuff. And I think--

JIMMY: Either that or there are swinger magazines available that many of the bookstores around.

CHRIS: OK, well, I mean, are there like swinger bars? I mean, I'm obviously--

JIMMY: I don't know about swinger bars to tell you the truth.

HOST 2: I think there's a few. I just--

JIMMY: I'm not familiar--

HOST 2: Actually saw channel two actually did--

JIMMY: Oh, really?

HOST 2: --a piece. I think there's one out in Alameda and then one by the Galleria.

JIMMY: I'm sorry I missed that.

CHRIS: Oh, that's good.

HOST 2: There's one by Alameda Mall. And I think there's one in the gallery area right behind Rick's Cabaret and [INAUDIBLE] from the [INAUDIBLE]. And there's a third one somewhere in North Houston that I have no idea where that's at.

JIMMY: Wish's Club on US 290 at West Little York was one of them. Wish's Club. Wish's.

CHRIS: Wish's Club.

JIMMY: Yeah, W-I-S-H-'-S.

CHRIS: Oh, that's cute.

JIMMY: Yeah.

HOST 3: Now, Chris, to get an idea-- in order to get an idea of what the gay community is like, a better idea of what the gay community is like here in Houston, come to the Gay Pride Parade the 29th of this month, which is a Saturday night.

CHRIS: Where is that going to be at?

HOST 2: On Westheimer.

CHRIS: On Westheimer?

JIMMY: Yeah, it's in the Montrose. It's Westheimer at Woodhead coming toward town.

HOST 2: East.

JIMMY: And ending at Whitney, and yeah--

CHRIS: Westheimer and Woodhead?

JIMMY: Yeah, we're talking about--

CHRIS: I can definitely remember Woodhead.

[LAUGHTER]

JIMMY: That's probably around the 1800 block of Westheimer.

CHRIS: OK, this is a late night show.

JIMMY: Yes, it is. Yes, it is.

HOST 2: The children are tucked in bed. And they're listening to their alarm clocks under the pillows.

HOST 3: [INAUDIBLE] turned off his hearing aid.

CHRIS: Oh, that brings back memories.

HOST 2: What brings you to Houston? I was in Cleveland last month, a couple of months ago actually.

CHRIS: Oh, is that right? Yeah, actually in Ohio, we call Cleveland the armpit of the universe actually.

JIMMY: Ouch.

CHRIS: So back in the '70s, they were able to set Lake Erie on fire. It's just so dirty, you know.

JIMMY: I've heard that Cleveland is Detroit without the glitter.

CHRIS: That's pretty accurate.

HOST 3: Ouch. Ouch.

HOST 2: Having visited, I would have to agree with both of you.

JIMMY: Well, welcome to Houston.

CHRIS: Well, thanks a lot. I appreciate it.

JIMMY: OK, and that parade is June the 29, Saturday night at 8:45 is when it starts. It's a nighttime parade.

CHRIS: OK, Westheimer and Woodhead.

JIMMY: It's too damn hot in Houston to have a parade during the day in June.

CHRIS: Oh, you are telling me. I'm dying to.

JIMMY: I bet you are.

HOST 2: We haven't even gotten into the hot part.

HOST 3: We haven't even begun yet.

HOST 2: Wait until August.

JIMMY: Yeah, but let me tell you. You will love January.

CHRIS: Oh, is that right?

HOST 2: Oh, yes.

JIMMY: We do not have snow here.

HOST 4: The Four Seasons of Houston, early summer summer, late summer, and February.

JIMMY: And once every three or four years, we have a freeze.

HOST 2: A big ice storm.

JIMMY: That's about it.

HOST 2: And it freezes. It shuts down the city for maybe two days, and--

JIMMY: That's it.

HOST 2: Everyone goes shopping.

HOST 3: Now, wait, I remember something like close to 10 years ago, we had about an inch of snow. And they shut down the freeways. And--

JIMMY: Yeah--

CHRIS: Oh, you got to be crapping me. That's crazy.

JIMMY: I know. I know. I know. But we're not used to that. We just don't have that.

HOST 2: People don't go to work--

CHRIS: [INAUDIBLE] jeez, I mean, 10 inches of snow, that's maybe a problem, but [INAUDIBLE] good grief.

HOST 2: Well, last year when we had 24 inches of rain.

JIMMY: Well, you see, if you go to work, and your building for some reason loses its air conditioning, you'll get the day off.

CHRIS: Oh wow, I really like that.

JIMMY: OK, well, thanks for calling in, Chris.

CHRIS: Thanks, y'all. Kisses.

JIMMY: Thanks. Bye. Oh, that's great to hear.

HOST 2: Yeah, that's nice.

JIMMY: New people in town. I like that. Where were we?

HOST 3: Oh, we're going to go back there, are we?

HOST 2: We should have asked Chris some of these questions actually. What type of body do you prefer? Our men answered 59% medium build, 32% muscular build, 16% again no preference. Again, the 2:30 AM crowd. Husky 15% and very thin 9%.

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

JIMMY: See, I'd like guys with-- I like husky guys.

HOST 2: Some meat on their bones.

JIMMY: Yeah, because I don't have any on my bones.

HOST 2: I want muscle.

HOST 4: Not touching that one. [INAUDIBLE]

HOST 2: Is size important to you?

JIMMY: I guess 69% of the people lied.

HOST 2: And said no.

JIMMY: Horribly.

HOST 2: Only 31% said yes and were being honest.

JIMMY: No. No.

HOST 3: It kind of reminds me of this whole Donnelly cartoon. Donnelly is this gay artist who used to do cartoons for some of the gay magazines, the porn magazines. And it had this one guy saying, no, I'm not a size queen, but I can be impressed. That 69%. And what an interesting number, 69. They're not even--

JIMMY: Yes, [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 2: And I guess we're talking about size and qualities. Another question was, what is the single most important quality in a man? 62% said personality, 12% said looks.

HOST 3: Liar.

HOST 2: 7% ambition, 6% sexual compatibility, others, other qualities 3%, and those included anything from economic stability, intelligence, honesty, romance, respect, generosity, maturity, sense of humor, and all of the above. And now questions about Hispanic Men's libido.

Going solo. How often do you masturbate? A few times a week, 40% said. Once a day, 23%.

JIMMY: Well, you know, that depends on how old you are.

HOST 2: I can remember in high school, like oh my God--

JIMMY: Like several times a day. Yes, I'm sorry. I didn't [INAUDIBLE]. I was just thinking back about oh, boy, was that fun. More than once a day.

HOST 2: 15%. And a few times a month, 11%.

JIMMY: There I am.

HOST 2: Once a week, 6%. Less than once a month, 4%. 1% never masturbate.

JIMMY: They lie. I'm sorry. All men masturbate. I don't care if they have two lovers or a wife and three lovers. I don't care. Men masturbate.

HOST 2: That's what we do.

HOST 3: Use it or lose it. This is kind of interesting because the next category kind of like contradicts the CDC.

JIMMY: What?

HOST 3: HIV and condoms. What is your HIV status?

JIMMY: Wait a minute?

HOST 3: HIV negative?

JIMMY: Where am I.

HOST 2: He skipped to page-- he skipped to the page that-- if you see going solo, you skip to the page right after that.

JIMMY: Oh--

HOST 3: That's on the same page as mine.

HOST 4: Oh, yeah, OK.

JIMMY: Never mind. Go ahead.

HOST 3: Oh, 85% said that they were negative.

HOST 2: 5% they were positive, 7% they didn't know, and 2% was no response.

JIMMY: Wow.

HOST 2: Let me tell you, those figures are skewed.

HOST 3: Really?

HOST 2: And I don't know if those were-- I was looking at those numbers earlier. And I wasn't sure whether that--

HOST 4: Well, I'm sure lot of those people who said they're negative, probably haven't been tested in quite some time.

JIMMY: Maybe that's it.

HOST 2: Yeah, it's either that or privacy issue and people aren't sure they want to fill out yes on a-- somewhere and send it off. But when you engage in anal intercourse, how often do you use a condom? 53% said every time, 22% most of the time, sometimes, 11%, don't know, never had anal sex, 8%, and never wore a condom, 7%.

JIMMY: Whew.

HOST 2: How many sexual partners have you had in total? 11 to 20.

JIMMY: Look, I grew up in the '70s. OK, you know, I came of age in the '60s. I grew up in the '70s.

And I was not unlike many men who just embraced the sexual revolution. And I have had more partners than most small towns have people--

HOST 4: Population.

JIMMY: --in Texas. Yes, I've had-- yes, lots.

HOST 3: Lots.

HOST 2: If you watch the Jerry Lewis telethon, as those numbers go up, you start-- it's like [INAUDIBLE].

JIMMY: [INAUDIBLE]

HOST 4: Like the sign at McDonald's.

HOST 2: If they had \$1 for every--

HOST 4: Billions and billions served.

JIMMY: No, actually-- one time I figured out just kind of by rounding things off that I had slept with over 6,000 different men. But this is from an era when you went to the tubs on the Saturday Night. And you had sex with several guys. And you had dates during the week. And you did this all the time. This is the way gay men acted.

HOST 3: We were dogs.

HOST 4: Yeah, and--

HOST 3: Now we're just sluts.

JIMMY: I don't know that you can call that good or you can call it bad. I mean, that's from an era where people didn't date. They just had sex.

So I actually prefer it more in the '90s when people actually get to know each other because there have been so many times when I got to know somebody. And I would not even talk to them much less have sex. You didn't know that at the time. It's just OK--

[INAUDIBLE]

HOST 5: On a minor, serious note, we're talking about the numbers. We've talked about the numbers of people. In my entire life, I have had sexual encounters with exactly three people. But it only took one of those people for me to be positive.

HOST 4: That's right. That's right. It's not how many people you have sex with. It's how you have sex.

HOST 5: Exactly.

HOST 2: How often do you currently have sex? 27-- oh, we were on the how many partners you've had. 11 to 20-- 22% said they've had sex from 11 to 25 partners. I would venture to say these answers were probably for this week, not their lifetime. Even in this more conservative era, Jimmy, I can assure you that's probably an underestimate.

JIMMY: Thank you. I don't feel quite so slutty. Well, I don't consider that-- I don't quite answer that a bad thing either.

HOST 2: 21% said they had sex with 5 to 10 people at a time. 18%, two to four-- over 100-- 12%, 26 to 50, 11%. 6%, had only sex with one person this morning.

JIMMY: How can you do that?

HOST 5: You're 15 years old.

JIMMY: Wrong-- wrong answer.

HOST 5: Have you seen the chat rooms lately?

HOST 2: 76--

[LAUGHTER]

76 to 100, it was 4%. How many times a week? 27% said they have sex a few times a week. Already there you see the disparity in those numbers.

A few times a month, 25%. Less than once a month, 24%. Once a week, 10%. Never, 7%. Once a day, 5%.

HOST 3: Liar.

HOST 2: More than once a day, 2%. Wow, lucky them.

JIMMY: Yeah, no kidding.

HOST 3: I know that's right.

JIMMY: Now, more than twice a day, those are the 15-year-olds.

HOST 2: Yeah.

HOST 5: Right.

JIMMY: OK, OK, now this is only Latino men, right?

HOST 5: Yes.

JIMMY: OK.

HOST 2: So again, this isn't very scientific. Those are people that sent back the survey, I'm sure. And of course, it's a little teleprompter right now saying that it's only in Catholic churches on Sundays [INAUDIBLE].

How many people are currently having sex with you? I mean, how many people are you currently having sex with? I don't know there's a difference to the question.

But only one person, 50%. I should say only one person if you're having sex with one person.

JIMMY: Many people are only having sex with one person. That's right. Themselves.

HOST 2: There ought to be a law or an organization. 50% said they're having sex with one person, not one, 35%. So does that mean none, or does that mean like--

HOST 4: More than one.

HOST 2: More than one.

JIMMY: No one. That must mean--

HOST 2: Oh, no one.

JIMMY: No one. They're just masturbating.

HOST 2: OK, 2 to 5 people, 14%. More than five people, 1%.

JIMMY: Liar.

HOST 2: On the wilder side.

JIMMY: Oh, here we go. Here's the good stuff.

HOST 2: What have you experimented with?

HOST 5: Yes, yes, yes, yes.

HOST 2: Uh-huh, uh-huh, yesterday, yes, this morning.

HOST 4: Not that one.

HOST 2: 52%-- this is an odd question because what have you experienced-- OK, this is-- OK, I guess this is how many of these people have experimented with these. So these numbers won't add to 100%.

JIMMY: No, they won't.

HOST 2: Because I was about to say if you've only tried one of these, that's a sad thing.

HOST 5: One or all.

HOST 2: 52% have tried threesomes. 39% have tried public sex.

JIMMY: Now that's like outside, like parks and--

HOST 2: Convertibles.

JIMMY: And then we have one here in the studio.

HOST 3: Of course, that reminds me of a--

HOST 4: Who just walked in.

HOST 5: Parks, beaches.

JIMMY: Are those grass stains on your jeans?

HOST 2: Public sex, 39%. Does that include convertibles?

JIMMY: Yes, it does. Yes, especially [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 2: Sex, bathhouses, grannies, 35% [INAUDIBLE] prefer to at our house.

HOST 3: Ouch.

HOST 2: Sex toys, 35% have experimented with. Orgies 22% have experimented with.

JIMMY: Yay for the orgies. Love a good [? mistletoe ?] party.

HOST 2: I'm all about building community.

[LAUGHTER]

In the Democratic Party, we call it outreach.

JIMMY: There you go. Yep, boy, Howdy.

HOST 3: (SINGING) Reach out and touch someone.

HOST 2: That was the motto of the Clinton years. S&M, 14%.

HOST 3: Is that standing and modeling?

JIMMY: Not quite, no.

HOST 2: Sex with a prostitute, 9%, other, 2%. Other responses included water sports, voyeurism, exhibition, and sex as a prostitute. So--

HOST 4: You mean a career.

JIMMY: What if you've done both? Sex with and sex as?

HOST 4: The best of both worlds.

JIMMY: There you go.

HOST 3: There you go.

HOST 4: You thinking about the old days, Jimmy?

JIMMY: Since 1969, still only \$15.

HOST 5: Right on the corner, right on the price.

HOST 4: Now accepting Mastercard.

JIMMY: Early bird specials do apply.

HOST 2: Don't be surprised if you get an email on Monday saying our show is now went from 1 to 1:30.

[LAUGHTER]

Sex with--

JIMMY: No-- that is--

HOST 2: AARP card discount available.

JIMMY: That is so wrong.

HOST 3: AARP discount available, oh.

HOST 4: Yeah, but you know--

JIMMY: I have my own AARP card, OK. You know it's 003.

HOST 2: I don't know how I got on their--

HOST 4: Do you want to make more money? Of course, we all do. Get rich quick.

JIMMY: You got on the list?

HOST 2: I don't know how I got in the mailing list. But every like quarter of the year, every three months, I get to apply now for your AARP membership.

JIMMY: Let me tell you something that is really disgusting. You're 49, and you're dreading it. You turn 50, and the first thing that happens is you get the application for an AARP membership card.

HOST 3: I know that's right.

JIMMY: They need to wait. Let me tell you, they just need to wait.

HOST 3: But wait though, Francisco is nowhere near 49. He's got at least a good 20 more. He's got a lot more years to go.

HOST 4: [INAUDIBLE] coming now.

HOST 3: I mean, Francisco still gets carded. He's so far away from [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 2: We need to put a webcam in here if everyone had like--

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

HOST 3: Oh no, we would lose-- we would certainly lose.

JIMMY: For the first show, that's not so bad. If we did that, I'd be playing music for three hours.

HOST 3: You know, there is a reason why we have a face for radio. You have a face for radio.

JIMMY: OK, OK.

HOST 2: Sex with non-Latinos. Does that happen?

JIMMY: I'm here to tell you why just this afternoon--

HOST 2: A lot of my friends are non-Latinos actually. And-- who was your first sexual experience? Who was your first sexual experience with, a Latino or a non-Latino? 73% said they had their first sexual experience with a Latino. 27% had their first sexual experience with a non-Latino. Interesting. Have you ever had sex with a non-Latino man? 81% said yes. 19% said no.

JIMMY: Wow.

HOST 2: Interesting [INAUDIBLE] question.

JIMMY: Yeah, that is.

HOST 3: I like this one over here, this set of questions over here [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 2: We got a little sidebar around here.

JIMMY: Yeah, [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 2: At what age did you first encounter a sexual-- at what age did you first encounter a sexual-- experience a sexual encounter? Under the age of 45% had their first sexual encounter at under 15.

HOST 4: Yeah, that's me.

HOST 3: That's me too.

HOST 4: I think I was eight or something.

HOST 3: That is definitely me.

HOST 2: 15 to 21--

HOST 5: I was 21.

HOST 4: I was four.

HOST 2: I was eight.

HOST 3: I was 10.

HOST 2: What would you consider a sexual experience? Would that be like flipping it out and showing your cousin and your cousin showing you kind of?

HOST 4: That means-- well, for me at age four, that means I was performing oral sex on the other four-year-old boy down the street.

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

HOST 3: No.

HOST 4: Yes, I was. Yes.

HOST 3: And I thought I was a hopeless case.

HOST 2: Well, you remember those kids in Central Texas that got busted having oral sex in the back of the elementary classroom--

HOST 4: Yes.

HOST 2: --during nap time.

HOST 3: What?

HOST 4: What's wrong with that?

HOST 2: I was just saying.

HOST 3: I never even heard about that. This is brand new breaking news to me.

HOST 2: Yeah, and they were all trying to figure out who started it. But the parents were like-- it's like look.

JIMMY: The whole idea of nap time is to relax, right?

HOST 2: Exactly.

JIMMY: There you go. I rest my case.

HOST 2: And our--

JIMMY: Oh, John Seda--

HOST 2: Played a cop on homicide and a mafia don on "Oz."

JIMMY: Someone called in and gave a state--

HOST 2: Someone called in that information.

JIMMY: Great, thank you. So it really is John Seda.

HOST 2: Wow. Sorry [INAUDIBLE] you've been bumped.

HOST 3: You're not on the list, John.

HOST 2: Thank you for playing. And 18 to 20-- 21% had their first sexual encounter between the ages of 18 and 20. 9% had 21 to 25 and 26 to 30 years were 2%.

JIMMY: Well, that shows that 89% of the men had sex 20 years--

HOST 2: Before they were old enough to drink.

JIMMY: Younger.

HOST 2: Before they were old enough to drink, they were swallowing. If you ever had a sexual-- have you ever had a sexual experience with a woman? Gay, Latino men, 57% said no. 43% said yes. Of the bisexual men, 18% said they had not had sex with a woman but called themselves bisexual. 82% said they had sex with a woman if they were identified earlier in the survey as bisexual Latino men.

Do you like to give or receive oral sex? I guess this is either or. Oh, no, it breaks it down specifically. Gay men said 80% of them like to receive. Stingy bastards.

JIMMY: No such gifting. Give and receive.

HOST 2: Receive only, 6%. Give only, 6%. Only half a percent didn't like oral sex.

HOST 4: What's wrong with them?

JIMMY: They don't-- half a percent didn't even know what it was?

HOST 2: They were going by--

HOST 3: I don't know. I think there's some lying going on in this.

HOST 2: That was those that were using the Clinton definition of sex.

HOST 3: Oh, that's right.

HOST 2: 75% of gay men--

JIMMY: Yeah, did they sleep during the Clinton years? Thank you, Chris.

HOST 2: Bisexual, Latino men said 75%, they give and receive. OK, that's what you were saying. 16% receive only. 2% give only. 2% said no, they don't do oral sex, and those 1/2%--

HOST 3: No, that was the full 5%.

HOST 2: Oh, that was a full 5% of bisexual--

JIMMY: Didn't know what it was?

HOST 3: A bisexual guy.

HOST 2: Didn't know what that was.

HOST 3: Not only did they not make up their mind. They don't even know what oral sex is.

HOST 2: They just have no idea.

HOST 3: Clueless.

JIMMY: Wow.

HOST 2: Do you give or receive anal intercourse? Gay men give and receive, 59%, receive only, 16%, give only, strictly tops, I guess, 15%, don't do anal intercourse, 6%. I think that count is probably a right figure. I know some people that don't-- very few. But there are some people that feel that way.

Bisexual men said they give and receive. 9% said they receive only. 30% give only. That's interesting.

JIMMY: Yeah, it is.

HOST 2: 11% said they don't do anal sex. 11%-- these poor men just don't know or have never done it or [INAUDIBLE].

HOST 3: You know what, though, on the gay men, I think it looks like these numbers, the gay Latino men, the numbers are pretty even on receive only and give only.

JIMMY: I need to get Chris in here because I needed for him to do a little thing on the Film Festival.

HOST 2: Yes, [INAUDIBLE]. That's your sex 101 class on the--

HOST 5: Computer.

JIMMY: I know. We were having a lot of fun reading all your comments.

HOST 2: That's our 101 course--

JIMMY: That's cool.

HOST 2: --on Latino men and what they like and don't like and would like to try and haven't tried. it's--

HOST 3: And you bisexual men, obviously, they are just clueless. They don't know what oral sex is. And they don't know what anal sex is.

HOST 2: So you've got your tips. Go out tomorrow. Happy hunting.

And thank you for listening to Latino segment. Chris is going to give us some information on the Gay and Lesbian Film Festival so we can all start enjoying some of that as that comes up. And we'll see you out in the community. And we'll see you next month at 2:00 something in the morning.

JIMMY: Yeah, I know. We'll talk. Thank you, Francisco.

HOST 2: Thank you.

JIMMY: And Hunter.

HOST 4: Thank you.

JIMMY: OK.

HOST 5: Chris.

CHRIS: Well, it'd help if you wouldn't kill my mic and your mic as you're talking.

JIMMY: Yes, [INAUDIBLE] whatever.

CHRIS: You did that to me last week too. You killed my mic. Well since we just did the Hispanic segment, we must start with burnt money.

JIMMY: Oh, OK, yeah, we sure should.

CHRIS: Well, once Roy leaves, I'll find someone who speaks Spanish here who could say this without destroying the language. Francisco--

FRANCISCO: Yes, sir.

CHRIS: Or Hunter, someone? [SPANISH]

HUNTER: [SPANISH]

CHRIS: OK. I try not to butcher too many languages. English is enough of a struggle. That's playing at the Angelika Film Center June 7 through the 13. And it is a-- *Burnt Money* is a gay Bonnie and Clyde based on the true story that occurred in Argentina and Uruguay between September and November of 1965. JIMMY: Caravaggio. Caravaggio.

HOST 2: The worse I had my name butchered was someone called and asked for Francois Sanche. Don't ask.

JIMMY: He turns into a drag queen.

HOST 2: My secretary was like rolling out of her chair.

CHRIS: Well, Jimmy, that's the first time you ever wanted somebody off of your back.

JIMMY: Careful.

CHRIS: So on Sunday June 9, starting at 5:00 PM, it's history lessons, *Escape to Life* and go ahead and say the Italian word again, Jimmy.

JIMMY: Caravaggio.

CHRIS: OK. On Monday, history lessons in Caravaggio will also be showing at the Museum of Fine Arts, which is located at 1001 [? Bissonnette. ?] Phone number for information is 713-639-7515.

And on Friday, at the Rice Media Center, the wedding video *Phantom* and *When Boys Fly* will be airing. For information at the Rice Media Center, it's at Rice University campus, entrance number 8. And that number is 713-348-4853.
