Despite two artificial needs. Rathbun continues to work but now as a volunteer caregiver for people with AIDS. A plaque on the wall commends her as 1987 Volunteer of the Year at San Francisco General Hospital's aids ward. Today like every Wednesday for the past five years, she's baking 350 cookies to bring on her Thursday visits to the hospital

aid sufferers. Rathbun says her friend from up north helps her obtain donated pot for her brownies. But somehow this time the Sonoma County Sheriff's Office heard about it and conducted an early morning raid

Rather than says she told the arresting officers what the brownies were for. But Lieutenant Chuck Smith says there's no good excuse for breaking the law.

The fact that somebody tells us that they're making brownies using marijuana isn't enough information for us to make a decision as to whether to or to not arrest. And the fact of the matter is she was committing a felony and that's where we act on the draft.
