If Queer Nation didn't keep this and many other issues in the press? These are just some of the many instances where Queer Nation is creating media attention to remind the community and the rest of the world that our fight for equal rights is far from complete. Do you remember when you were a gay teenager and thought you were the only one with feelings of such shame and guilt that you thought you'd be better off dead? I'm proud of queer nation? No, I'm not a queer national as they call themselves. I'm just sick and tired of being a second class citizen. And I'm sick and tired of the flat Queer Nation is getting. They're putting their jobs on the line for the benefit of all and they're not getting any of the support they deserve. For many in the community. I could not become a Houston police officer even if I wanted to. I could not join the military without lying about who I am. I cannot claim my lover on my company insurance even though we've been together longer than most

heterosexual at my place of employment. I'm subjected to harassment without any legal protection. Many changes do need to come to our government and society. And they will not be made by the disgruntled Queens complaining about Queer Nation. Wake up gay Houston. I've yet to witness your tolerance straight friends, whom you think Queer Nation is alienating protesting for your rights. Quit bitching and start doing something.
