And those kinds of paintings we see today they sell for 10 or \$20 million. See my friends See, this is not craziness. This is something truly to be respected. After a certain point in time there was a an apparent or there was rather no apparent need to paint a tree exactly like the tree we had in front of us. There was a need what a drive to paint what would Barbara Davis would call the essence of a tree. Artists broke away from the Orthodox

representation. Shortly after the turn of the century, artists along with virtually any other professionals, be gone. Like what my good doctor friends psychiatrists Leo Burrell will call thinking outside of the box. But it would be interesting to see all this started and buy home. In the early part of the 20th century, literary artists reviews were a primary means by which the creative community exchanged ideas and remained in communication vehicle for promoting emerging styles, establishing new theories, and creating a context for understanding new visual forms. This review played a pivotal form in forming the spirit and identity of movements such as dada da da, and surrealist and serve to spread their message throughout Europe and the United States. John R. Richard, who's in back Marcelo yanco. Sophie Tobler and Tristan Zara were among the artists and poets who represented and began gathering at the Bowles Zurich stubborn. Through uproarious evenings filled with noise, music, abstract poetry readings and other performances, data began to voice its aggressive message. While data evening soon became notorious for insurrection and powerful assaults on arts and bourgeois culture. It was through data journalists that the news of this development movement reached all corners of Europe and even the United States.
