The Church of England has confirmed that it's repressed a report commissioned in 1986 which recommended that the church considered blessing gay and lesbian relationships. The 134 page report was written by a committee headed by London Deaconess June Osborne, but it was never made public. A report said that many gay men and lesbians have had bad experiences with the Church of England, and that the church's bishops have a quote particular responsibility to set a tone of welcome and acceptance. Top church officials say that the report is advisory, not policy, and it will not be published.

Opponents of the new Massachusetts gay and lesbian civil rights law have gathered enough signatures to qualify a repeal measure for the state general election ballot, according to the Secretary of State's office, opponents file All petitions were 60,000 signatures, although they only needed 25,000. Last November, Massachusetts became the second state in the US to pass anti discrimination protections for lesbians and gay men. Opponents of the measure originally insisted that religious institutions be exempt from the anti discrimination law. That exemption was included to get the bill passed in the legislature. Ironically, the Massachusetts State Constitution prohibits repeal of any legislation which contains religious content, and the state Supreme Judicial Court must now decide whether placing the repeal measure before the voters would violate that constitutional provision.

An experimental AIDS drug that tricks the virus and then disarms it is safe for human use. That's the result of two studies of CD4 released this week. Scientists from San Francisco and Massachusetts say the drug may be especially effective when used in combination with AZT. CD4 is a human-made protein that lowers the virus away from healthy cells and then neutralizes it. ACT UP member Allen Beck offered the additional criticism that money allocated in the budget is often not spent.

David Lewis of the Vancouver people with Aid Society explains why he and other non American HIV positive people won't be attending the sixth International AIDS Conference in an interview with Rob Atkinson.

Last year, when the fifth International Conference on AIDS was held in Montreal, the Canadian government temporarily suspended its immigration regulations, which otherwise bar people with AIDS from entering the country. The Montreal organizers convinced Canadian officials that the presence and participation at the conference of HIV positive people was essential for a meaningful exchange of ideas and information between the experts and the people carrying the virus. This year, San Francisco is the site of the six international AIDS conference. As in Canada, American immigration laws can deny entry to HIV positive people. And to complicate things US immigration officers can also turn away at the border people they suspect of being gay or lesbian. At a specially convened international meeting, people with AIDS decided to boycott the San Francisco conference. David Lewis of the Vancouver AIDS Society explains why

one of the ways that people with AIDS are being discovered and American borders is they look at people who they think are obviously gay, whatever that means. And then they are taking these obviously gay people for secondary infections, finding A's and T and their luggage or

AIDS related drugs and not allowing them into the country. What would satisfy our concerns is would be the American government lifting all restrictions for people with AIDS going into the United States for any reason, not just for the conference,

organizers of the San Francisco conference have publicly criticized American immigration policy. They fear the exclusion of foreign HIV positive people will prompt other participants to pull out the International Red Cross has already done so.
