The feat is usually accomplished in one of two ways, and both a team consisting of two mounted individuals. The first method calls for one team member to rope and restraint restrain this stair. I don't have my glasses girl rope and restrain the stair while the other one does the ribbon tying duties.

The team with the fastest time wins. The second method entails one members bulldogging the steer bulldogging the steer whenever it's holding it down and wrestle it to the ground. Oh, okay. While the other one does the ribbon work again fastest time wins. Another possible method is running the event on foot. One contestant dogging the steer while the other one ties the ribbon on the tail, then races on foot across the finish line. Again fastest time wins.

Imagination a competitive spirit and a sense of humor have led to the creation of such group events in rodeo which are crowd pleasers and contested just for the hell of it. And right now they are putting chalk lines around I'm not sure exactly what all that's for.
