But it's usually the third Tuesday of every month we meet a Gentry just to be social.

And I just enjoy getting out out there and meeting people and helping my community. And what really changed my life is last year I was Imperial Princess, Imperial Princess, listen. We can tell this is 90% drag, imperial prince Imperial Prince Royale. Last year, I had the opportunity as my main beneficiary along with the need of man who was the Imperial Princess Royal at that time, our beneficiary was the Loving Arms Foundation. And what really changed my life is when I went by, and we decided talked about several different organizations to our main beneficiary to go by and visit their new location. And just talk to the children is children living with AIDS. And to hold a baby in my arms, a little baby that was like, like a month old. It made a big difference.
