The headline is Warner pulls ad on Clinton's gay rights stance, and that's somewhat confusing title the actuality here is that there was an ad run on Warner Cable by a group called the Christian Action Network. And let me just turn Jules microphone off so you won't hear her giggling in the background as she's on all fours on the floor in the booth, looking for her beeper. The bottom of her beeper. Okay, well, we will find it I know we will. I have faith. Right now. Jimmy is on all fours and the bottom of the slide like get on my knees here this like make it appropriate. Thank you. I appreciate that. Okay, back to the Houston Post cover the Houston Post. There was an ad by the Christian action network that was played on Warner Cable. And it was saying that Clinton's stance on homosexuality would basically be the downfall of America because he

thought that gay people were okay. Yeah, we found it. Yeah. Okay. be profound. Back to add. public pressure has prompted Warner cable to pull a controversial 32nd and targeting presidential candidate Bill Clinton support of gay rights Warner Cable announced Friday. The ad paid for by the Christian Action Network ran Monday through Wednesday and was pulled Thursday said Mark hertz, Vice President for sales and marketing. He cannot estimate the number of calls we're gonna receive said they were enough to kill the commercial. This means guys and girls that your phone calls count keep calling. We pay a lot of attention to what people are saying all the time. He said officials of the Christian Action Network alleged in a press release that Clinton's vision for a better America was canceled because of protests, calls and bomb threats. But hurt said there were no bomb threats or other types of violence. Houston police reported they had no record of bomb threats against Warner Cable. The controversial commercial has been rejected by many television stations nationwide as being hateful. I want a cable spokesman said earlier this week the ad was accepted because it does not censor its advertisers. It aired on CNN between eight and 10pm Martin mall your president of Christian action network announced Friday in Lynchburg, Virginia. The Christian Action Network will continue its goal of airing our commercial in 50 cities and informing voters across the land of the Clinton Gore position on homosexual rights sexual. The network purports to be a grassroots lobbying organization with more than 200,000 supporters nationwide. You know what this means?
