Good morning. This is the after hours report. I'm Jeff Mackey. Since runoff elections always draw fewer people to the polls. Each vote takes on added importance as next Tuesday's April 10 runoff election nears across the state. There are eight key runoff races of great interest to the gay community. Hitting the ballot is the Texas governor's race on the Democratic ticket and Richards versus Jim Maddox. Richards goes into the runoff a slight favorite, having garnered 39% of the vote to Maddox and 37% in the March primary. But the race has turned into a matter of ethics for both candidates. Richards has yet to come clean on the matter of whether she ever use drugs and medics is yet to come clean on disclosing how he made all this money while state attorney general. Although Richards goes into the runoff for both the lead and votes and overall support of gay and lesbian endorsements, Medic still maintains loyal support among many of the gay electorate. In the Richards camp are the endorsements of the statewide lesbian gay Democrats of Texas. The Dallas lesbian gay political action committee, the Houston gay lesbian caucus, Community Alliance of Houston and the Austin LDPC. All five political groups a Richards is their favorite candidate on gay related matters of concern. But Maddox supporters point to his past support of gay issues and to his unflinching devotion to the AIDS issue. He was Maddox as attorney general who ruled that the Texas Department of Health could not deny state funding to AIDS organizations just because they employed homosexuals. The medics opinion frees up aids funds here to for denied gay and lesbian groups. It means that gay men and lesbians who have been in the forefront can still remain there and should remain there said gay rights lobbyists Glen Maxi, although Richard supporters say the charismatic State Treasurer is the most qualified candidate to support the gay community as governor. There are those who agree that either Democratic candidate would be acceptable to gays, as the leader of Dallas LDPC puts it it's a win versus win situation. The race in Harris County for Democratic Party chair has sparked more interest than any other race among Houston voters. This is a spicy race between front runner Ken Benson and challenger Leslie Perez. Benson, the nephew of US Senator Lord Benson has been squeaky clean throughout the race. Well Perez, on the other hand has set up a fire store. Perez has been asked to step out of the race by party officials. But she said she wouldn't consider stepping aside. While told if you're about it's about prisons past which encompasses a sex change operation and a prison sentence served for the torching murder of a Houston salesman back in 1961. The controversy was flamed by a blazing post election headline in the Houston Chronicle, killer transsexual and runoff for county chair. Although the Chronicle later said it regretted the wording of its headline, the damage to Perez was done. nonetheless. There are even those in the gay community that aren't working for prisons victory, Houston gRPC has made no endorsement for Perez instead in a lopsided vote last week and voted 37 to four to endorse Benson, Mike Charlton, the candidate whom both the gRPC and community, in Ch endorse who lost and he was working for the election of Benson. But there are those in the mainstream who are supporting Perez, former Houston Independent School Board Member It was MySpace said she has spoken with Perez and said yes, I'm going to support her. She has as much right to run as anyone else. All campaign rhetoric aside next Tuesday's runoff for Harris County party chair has turned out to be the hottest and most controversial races town. Nikki van Hightower versus Tom Bowden for state treasurer. In this race declare favorite of the gay and lesbian communities Houstonian Ben Hightower, the former Harris County Treasurer hopes to win the race for State Treasurer to replace and Richards. Hightower is endorsed by the Dallas I GPC. Houston G RPC and the community alliance of Houston. Hightower goes into next Tuesday's run off the front runner, having received 36% of the march 13 primary vote to only 27% For Bowden. In other news in Fort Worth police officer John Bryan Yarborough has been charged with the capital murder in the shooting death of a Fort Worth gay man Jerry Lee Shaw 29, a hairstylist at Jerrell James saloon. The shooting took place at a rest area on Interstate 35 west near Burleson. Texas shot died after the policeman shot him three times. The Tarrant County Gay Alliance reported that officer

Yarborough had reportedly become obsessed with the rest resting gay people at rest stops and parks and would often work the parks in his off duty hours. It got to where Yarber would hide working the roadside Park from the sheriff's and an acquaintance who had worked with your burn Fort Worth. Although Yarborough had a clean record while working for 17 years with the Fort Worth police department a TCGA investigation showed yarborough's work record went downhill after he became the chief deputy of the Wise County Sheriff's Department. The Sheriff's Department terminated Yarbrough after he was charged with two counts of exchanging sex for leniency leniency with a female prisoner. That case has yet to go to trial. So the shot murder is not the first time also Yarborough has been involved in a sex related offense.
