And where we're heading is, we're looking at not only hiring a staff person, but an executive director, oh, within the next year, and we're looking at becoming a bisexual voice, a beacon for the BI community by working with media, and responding to issues as they come up. And doing it in a much more professional manner than we have in the past. By nets had a lot of accomplishments over its 12 years. And with the little bit of funding that we've always had very little organization. It's amazing what has been accomplished. But the things coming up, we've been working on a fundraising drive. And we have raised a lot of money already. Really, our immediate goal was to have 5000 in hand and 1800 a month coming in and pledges by the end of the year. And with 15,000 in hand by March, and the short weeks since the meeting, annual meeting, we have already raised over 8500 and hand Whoa. So we are working on a major fundraising drive right now all over the country. We're looking for people who want to support by net USA by joining Project 387. We're looking for 200 people around the country to donate 1250 per month. And that's about \$3 a week. In addition, we're looking for another 197 folks who can donate between 25 and 200. Monthly. So it's something that's really, you know, we've never really looked at trying to raise a large budget in the past. So this is a whole new direction. Yeah. We've got a interim steering committee member, three of them right now serving kind of as a governing body until we hire the executive director and we're rewriting our bylaws, and we'd like to buy part of that.
