And a nationwide campaign of organized intolerance led by the religious right, often supported by local clergy and public officials is denying equal rights to Americans who are singled out for discrimination based on their own sexual orientation. And this comes from the 1998 edition of People for the American Way Foundation's annual report on anti gay violence. And the name of that report is hostile climate report compiles and analyzes a nationwide sampling of intolerant incidents directed against gays and lesbian Americans in 1997. It reveals that out of 170 incidents described in the report when it just right organizations were involved in nearly 40% of the cases. The religious right has poisoned the public dialogue about gay and lesbian rights. And as a result of our public discussion of these issues, it's often stuck in the Dark Ages. Now the religious right is playing a destructive game of blaming the victims of anti gay and lesbian discrimination. Now in Costa Mesa, California, a radio talk show host said civil magistrates are out are to put people to death who practice these things. Now this year's report includes incidents from 40 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico as well as incidents that are Nash Still in scope. The incidents ranged from legislative attacks on equal rights to employment discrimination, harassment and even beatings of high school

students that are sometimes ignored or abetted by school officials for Vincent of hate speech and hate inspired violence, to report groups to discriminatory incidents according to six categories, employment, arts, entertainment, marriage, family, education, religion and general intolerance, to religious rights attack on award winning award winning film, it's elementary teaching about gay issues in schools, which is used to train teachers about how to deal with gay and lesbian issues in the classroom. They claim that its purpose is cynical, recruiting of new generations to become homosexuals, as if we can recruit people to be homosexual. Many incidents involve efforts to deny employment to gay men and lesbians or to block them from receiving the same benefits routinely provided to heterosexual employees.
