And that I, in my opinion, is what's going to finalize it not only for a lot of the homosexual community, but for this man's family. For Yep, and even then, I don't think it'll be over for them. No, they've lost a person that's close to him. So they'll have to find closure within themselves. Okay, you're gonna hear a lot of paper rustling? Because we found a lot of different stuff in a lot of different magazines. Speaking of not being people not being happy that gays and lesbians or gays are here. You found an article in which one triangle and the triangle? Yes, and I'm gonna get to it right here. This is about I'll read the headline here it's Baptist urge Disney boycott. And it's a Florida, Florida Baptist group has asked its 1 million members to boycott Walt Disney Company parks and produce products. Because Disney extended health insurance to partners of homosexual workers say it will ask its national group to do the same. Now, the res the resolution asked members to pray fully prayerfully reconsider their continued purchase in support of Disney products. It was it was prompted by Disney's decision last month to extend insurance benefits. It was also sad Disney hosted homosexual and lesbian themed nights at its parks and produced questionable material through subsidiaries, such as Miramax movie company, which Disney acquired in 1993. So why were we invited? I don't know. Yeah. That's right, invite us to go right along with that there were 15 Florida legislators, just in the past week in Tallahassee, Florida, that wrote to the CEO of Disney. And they disagreed, again, with the company's domestic partners, insurance extension, the 15 legislators charged Disney with belittling the sanctuary of marriage, and forcing it Disney's customers to pay for the treatment of people with AIDS through new health coverage, that will result in an increased number of AIDS cases. Now how these people made this connection is beyond me. Just because the company decides to extend its health policies, does not mean there's gonna be an increase in prices at Disney, which if you've been there,

pretty steep. But that doesn't mean there's gonna be an increase. And just because they tend to do that does not automatically mean there's gonna be an increased number of AIDS cases. Well, no, like any insurance company, they're gonna want background of their right of the people that are applying for insurance, regardless of who they are. It doesn't necessarily mean that they're going to get more AIDS patients. That's right. Because in most cases, when when you tell an insurance company that you're gay, they're going to assume that you're going to be at risk or you're trying, you're putting yourself at risk. So they the amount of time when they start paying on those particular illnesses, HIV is longer anywhere from a year to two years. Plus, if, if they're considered to be at risk, which would not only be a gay man, but would be promiscuous female, or promiscuous male or even a lesbian, or anybody at this point. Or an IV drug user, which won't get past the Disney drug screening tests, but those people are going to pay higher rates anyways. And it's up, it's between Disney and employee whether they match it. What I really like and I found this article and outsmart was Disney's response. The Disney response said the company had no intention of reversing itself on the new policy. Instead, it was consistent with the firm's non discrimination policy. They said this is about providing health benefits for employees. He's and nothing more. And the rest of the article goes on to say that when and if Disney gets the letter, then they'll answer it. Well, isn't something very similar to this happening in Austin, which is there are some various companies in Austin, that are offering health benefits to part. It's right there was a company that was going to move into Austin, or into a smaller town here in Texas. And it had its policies, it extended the health insurance to gay and lesbian partners. And the small town said, No, you can't do that. And Austin said, Wait, we'll put in the bid for the big. So in most situations, when you're running into something like that, you're cutting off your nose to spite your face, right? You can't you can't have everything. That's right. And it is you're you're talking about people's people's companies, and the way they run them, we cannot legislate to people how they have to run their companies, who they are supposed to extend benefits to and who they're not. I don't understand how people can say that and still believe that we live in a free country. Well, when the people are like just when the government is legislating everything down to even there's a hate speech or hate speech piece of legislation going on now. It's not a free country anymore. It is now moving more socialist. And it's it's not right. Also found something funny. Again, in outsmart it says the top 10 reasons why Heaven is empty in hell is full. The first reason is homosexuality. Number 10. Number nine is self sexual stimulation. Number eight is dreaming of sex. Number seven is women own their period going into a church. Number six is wearing clothes made of polyester and cotton. Number five is eating cheeseburgers. The fourth one is drinking a milkshake with your hamburger. So you can't mix meat and milk. Oh, okay. It's not kosher. Right, right. eating shrimp, oysters and clams, eating pork. And then they say the number one reason why Heaven is empty in hell is full is because they're playing football.
