Yeah, um, what I try to explain to a lot of people who are not in the scene and are not educated is that this is completely different than going out there and beating up somebody. Well, s&m is consensual right. Abuse is not. It's also it's all it also can be sexual. Yes. But it's not abuse. Abuse is harmful, hurtful, where SM is it really? Well, there's a little there's a little place in here. This is SM play has never done with the intention of really harming the well being of a submissive. Abuse is done with the intention of causing harm. That's the big difference here. Right. Well, another big differences. As news abuse is done behind closed doors, it's secretive. Nobody knows about it. As soon as all upfront, it's open. If it wasn't you and I would not be sitting here talking about it. Exactly. Exactly. And there, they give you a nice list of go into them and talk about him for a bit. Each one will start off with the first one, which is as an employee is always consensual abuse never is right touched on that just now. Right? And then I went on to read the second one as them has never done to intentionally hurt someone. Abuses if you'll read the third one, Stacy, it simply is negotiated and agreed upon ahead of time. We're abuse. It never is. It's just something that happened. Yeah. Yeah, talked about a little bit as far as contracts go, yeah, sitting down and discussing, you know, what your boundaries are, right and getting to know your partner before you start to play with them that's basically enhances both the situation and you have the opportunity of having both parties enjoying themselves, right. That should tell you something about it not being abuse the charity to take the time to sit down and negotiate what's going to happen to you. You don't negotiate abuse. That's right. That's right. Just for people who don't know our little SM Bible here. If you're not used to negotiating or talking, they have two different types of negotiating forms in the book that really help once you get started talking. It's something that Charlie brought up. What she noticed between my relationship and the person I'm involved with now, is we because we're so open about talking about sex and fantasies and things like that. We're also open about talking about other things as well. So she noticed that and she feels like it's more stable relationship. Of course, I just happen to agree. Well, that goes on to say that SM play enhances a relationship. Abuse damages. That's right. I guess the key issue here is to again to say that we're not we have no intention of seriously hurting someone permanently, right. This is and it's all consensual. That's right. It's something that is agreed about and talked about before we keep women let me clarify something we keep saying that we have no real intention of harming someone. That's true. We don't. We're talking about permanent harm. Right. Okay. I was gonna say different levels of pain affect different people. You've got your niche. You've got your you're talking about different edges, okay. And we're talking about permanent harm here. If you're going to break someone's arm that's permanent harm, and that is not going to be consensual. Right? s&m play people who play with s&m or play in the scene. take on responsibilities they take on the responsibilities and the actions that are happening within that scene. Abusers don't they don't end they also abusers have no rules. That's right. They make up the rules as they go along if they have any at all. As an s&m play may be requested and even eagerly desired by a submissive, nobody ever asked or desires to be abused. Right? SM play can be very erotic or of abuse is not erotic at all. SM play can be stopped in an instant at any time by either party or anyone involved in it. By just mentioning a code word where abuse cannot be an s&m play the dominant always keeps their emotions under control and abusers emotions are out of control. After s&m Play the submissive and off the submissive often feels great. grateful towards the dominant a victim never feels grateful towards an abuser. Try now there are warning signals that are put out that I guess if is this all we're gonna was all I was gonna go into because those are. Those are the big

generalities. Those are the things that most people see. And most people talk about when it's me when I first mentioned that I'm involved in the scene. They're like, Oh, how can you do that? You hurt someone I'm like, wait a minute know where you are in this thing? What do you mean? No, not at that point. No, because I'm doing okay. She's hurting someone. Wait a minute, is this the Stasi we know and love? No, but it's just there's such a big difference. That's why I think the safe sane and consensual credo is very important. Another thing that we have not mentioned in a while is you can't You don't do this on drugs, or alcohol, that's part of the safe. Well, it says when it says here that, number one, if you are going to be willing to accept responsibility for your actions, you have to be in total control of your actions, right? You can't be in control if you're on drugs, any type of drugs or alcohol, right? You also cannot accept the responsibility of your actions. That's right. When you when you really have nothing to govern those actions. And you and you do release a lot of your inhibitions. And then you put yourself and the person that you're that you're playing with in danger. That's right. That's right from both sides. From both sides, just like perfect example. I've been out tonight, I've been having a really great time. I've had a few drinks. I'm not going to play tonight. Probably you may go home and have sex, we may go home and have sex. But there is a difference we won't play tonight. That's another thing people think SM and sex are the same thing. We've touched on this before. And for you and I this is repetitive, but it's something that needs to be out there. They are different. Oh, they're very different. Because I've said so many times before. I'm a gay man. I have been and s&m scenes that have involved women. That does not mean that I was sexually aroused, or that I was having some type of sexual I will in a way I was having non sexual contact in a seductive way. Right? It had nothing to do with sex. Right? And so many people think that these these scenes and these these play times and and sex and and a majority of the time they don't. And a lot of people think they're just big orgies which they apply for. I have been to have even had allowed any type of penetration. And I I don't know, you know, the last time I went to an orgy was probably in 1980 something, and I do believe sex was involved. Okay, so if you have any questions on SSM, you can always contact me through fist, you can always go pick up sm 101 at crossroads, which they finally got all their copies in, I'm happy about. So now that I had to go to Chicago to get my copy. I guess the biggest the biggest way you could tell the difference between an s&m relationship and an abusive relationship was if you had them sitting side by side. If you did an interview with a submissive, right and did an interview with someone who is being abused, then you would be able to tell the difference, right? Being that we're involved in the SM community, we know the difference, right? Anytime someone decides they want to hurt you or maim you in any way without your consent. You are being abused. It's, it's also considered a form of Write, write. Write? Also, this does not negate mental abuse. Oh, not at all. Not at all. Most of the because our community is the wider community is such sticklers about rules. We have rules that we go by to try and we don't play mind games. In that sense in that sense of the word we don't You're right. That's dangerous, and you don't want to play with people's emotions. So and the type of mind games that would be played are like sensory deprivation and so on right are completely different than abuse. Yes. And they are like you said they are erotic. Yep. You are listening to 90.1 KPFT Houston, and 89.1 KEOS College Station, Bryan, quit radio with that attitude. Jimmy, you had a special dedication you wanted to do?
