A gay bar in the Oaklawn area of Dallas, with patrons at the bar witnessed a heated verbal argument that escalated to a fistfight on the outside patio, which resulted in a non fatal shooting. The suspect fled over a petty offense into the parking lot and escaped in a stolen vehicle. Dallas police followed the suspects car down Cedar Springs Road until a high speed chase resulted in the suspects vehicle running into a pole. The suspect then fled on foot into a wooded trail that escaped police. The suspect became angry that caused the incident when just a simple

bumping into another person at a bar in the bar, according to witnesses, someone was the the victim was winning the fight when he threw the suspect into the corner of the bar. At that time, a second suspect began hitting the victim over all of his body restrained him. And then the first suspect brought on a semi automatic weapon from his pocket and fired into the victim's abdomen. So it's we're seeing some of this even more violent, at least, at least what we could would say on this part is looks like it was just your typical barroom Brawl brawl. This was a patron getting upset with another patron This is not an attack from outside the community coming in. And that's

Well, I think what we're seeing here is a situation where the beginning elements of this was the fact we're living in an increasingly dangerous and difficult society. And we're here in Texas, the fact that you are allowed to carry a concealed weapon, not into a club, you're not allowed into a club, but the fact that people will are allowed to carry it. And there's not any checking that you see at majority of clubs, the only clubs that you really will see or hear about a cursory search. I mean, just a good hard physical, visual examination of a person coming into a club, or even a pat down or a metal detector is usually at your large raves where you have a lot of teenage kids coming in there, or at mostly your minority clubs. And this is a situation we haven't seen in the gay establishment. We don't see it. Don't even hear it that often really in the mainstream straight community. We hear about it more often in a heated dispute where someone actually goes out to their car and gets the gun out of the car. But I think this is one of the few times where we're seeing someone who carried a concealed weapon into a club which is illegal in the first part. But then to go and have something escalate this standard is totally over is totally unusual for any sort of establishment I think not just in the gay community,

The unprecedented numbers indicate that somewhere in America every day, at least three gay and lesbian Americans are being targeted for a crime simply because they're gay. People continue to die in America and families continue to be torn apart. While Bush and the GOP leadership pretend these types of crimes do not exist, says Human Rights Campaign. Last week, the FBI released the Uniform Crime Reports for 1999 The latest year for which the statistics are available, as overall serious crime continued to decrease for the eighth consecutive year, hate crimes based on sexual orientation have continued to rise and increased 4.5% from 1998 to 1999. Reported hate crime incidents based on orientation have more than tripled since the FBI began collecting statistics and 1991 column comprising 16.7% of all hate crimes. For 1990. Set nine hate crimes based on sexual orientation continued to make up the third highest category after race and religion, which makes which they those categories make up 54 and a half percent and 19 point, I mean 17.9% respective of the total 7876 crimes. It is widely known that hate crimes based on sexual orientation are generally under reported. And evidence indicates that the FBI data does not paint the whole picture. The National Coalition of anti violence programs a private organization that tracks bias incidents against gay lesbian, bisexual and transgendered people reported 1965 incidents in 1999, nearly 2000 incidents in 1999, based on sexual orientation, you know, this is what the FBI statistics are showing nearly 2000 In one year alone. So folks, we do have a serious problem. Don't let people tell you that, Oh, it's getting easier, because it's not. And then we have people going into Dallas clubs, carrying concealed weapons who may very well be part of the gay community. Folks, if you have a gun, leave it at home.
