and secrecy. Ah. Yeah, good point. Yes. You like I was talking about earlier pet throws play parties. My lover and I participate in private play parties. These are parties thrown specifically for and Sam. So that's it's all done out in the open. Yeah. As I said, yeah, yeah. SM play has responsible and agreed upon rule, abuse lacks rules. SM play may be requested or even eagerly desired by all parties. Nobody else. Nobody ever asked for abuse. That's true. That's true. SM plays erotic abuse is not erotic. SM play can be stopped in an instant at any time for any reason by anybody in this scene. The victim cannot stop their abuser in any way.
