Though the actual number of crimes motivated by prejudice remained small according to figures released by the Houston Police Department. And much of this increase is due to better reporting by the victims and the cities more than 5300 police officers, says Lieutenant Mark Eisenman, who was appointed the department's hate crime coordinator by Mayor Lee Brown back in April. There's a hate crime hotline and you can call them at area code 713-308-8737. Now some of these hate crimes that have occurred in careers if you are aware of any of these particular ones go ahead and jump right in here. There was an aggravated assault on December 7, a 3100 block of South Sheppard, with a suspect yelled anti gay slurs and then tried to run down his victim. There was criminal mischief which happened on October 15. On the 8600 block of gentlemen, when anti gay graffiti was painted on an auto there was an aggravated assault on October 12, when a man mistaken for gay was stabbed while walking his dog and delivering her block of Hadley and this there's been also it was a retired professional wrestler. The one signed sign on the Stanford side was spray painted over. And that's been since cleaned off. But the important thing is you have if you're if this happens to you, let people know. Call the HPD hotline, call queue patrol, let us know that something is happening in the area. So that we can go out and keep a closer eye on the area by people and just let our people know, to keep be a little bit more vigilant in those areas. So we can kind of prevent these things. And that's the cue patrol phone number is 713528. Safe. And also, if you need help with that contact the Montrose counseling center there is a hate crimes part in there. We send all of our reports at Q patrol to HPD and the Montrose Counseling Center where they compile the information. And they have a great support group there the support team, not a group yet. I may have a group, I'm not sure. But they can help you get through that and get some information. But you need to report it. Even if it's a small if you think it's small and insignificant, someone just screaming something at you. Remember what they're yelling at you today out their car window, they may be yelling at the other end of a baseball bat to another person the next weekend.
