We urge Congress to exercise authority under the United States Constitution and pass legislation withholding jurisdiction from the federal court in cases involving family law, especially a changes in the traditional definition of marriage. We further call on Congress to pass and the state legislature to ratify a marriage amendment, declaring that marriage in the United States shall consist and be recognized only as the union of a natural man and A Natural Woman. Neither the United States nor any state shall recognize or grant any unmarried person the legal rights or status of a spouse.
