And they have a mobile voting thing to make sure that all of the city employees vote on the tax referendum. And it goes from police station to solid waste disposal unit at shift change. And it's amazing what the city can do if they want to. My name is at the bottom of the ballot. I am and how many people are 16 candidates on page one, there are 16 candidates and Ray Hill is at the very bottom. So I would encourage folks if you don't get a chance to vote tomorrow, and I would encourage you do that if you can or call somebody to vote for you if you're outside the city and you know people in the city Tuesday's a good day, the early voting is going to be open seven days a week until the 14th. And I think that after last year's nasty, ugly evil campaign, I mean, if Dolly Madison McKenna was going to wet the pant leg. Lloyd avoid Benson's nephew one more time. And I don't know what steve stockman and his opponent were doing to one another, but it really sounded nasty. I think people need to vote like impulse buyers.
