The documents concerned 1000s of gays and lesbians detained under the law of social dangerousness. The files have been archived in Madrid since the death of Generalissimo Francisco Franco Baja Monday in 1975, the oppressive dictator rule for over three decades,

half of all the Catholic priests in the United States have broken their vows of celibacy, and 80% have committed sexually mortal sins in the eyes of the church. According to a new study reported in the Boston Sunday globe. The 25 year study involving over 1000 priests was conducted by Richard SIPE a psychologist and former priest and was presented at the annual meeting of the American Psychological Association, which met in Boston earlier this month. The study revealed that 20% of those interviewed had engaged in homosexual relationships, and although it is considered a mortal sin in the Catholic Church 80% had reported masturbating. SIPE told the psychological gathering that his study points out that the 800 year old celibacy requirement has repressed the Catholic Church's view of human sexual nature, leaving it quote, quite literally underdeveloped and immature.

However, in St. Louis County Missouri, the local chapter of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays has been denied a request to participate in the program. According to Arthur worth of the St. Louis chapter of the parent support group, the county board denied the request because they were uncomfortable with a prospect of a sign honoring the group by name along the roadway. The board may respond to the parents protest by eliminating signs on all adopted roadway projects, or by changing all of the signs with a more generic message which will simply thank a group of concerned citizens.

Douglas Weeds Special Assistant for Public Liaison to US President George Bush has been fired. No official reason was given for the dismissal. Although we'd had been the most vocal critic of the administration's inviting gay men and lesbians, to the public signing of both the Hate Crime Statistics Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act last May. In response to complaints, he wrote leaders of the religious right saying that the President's staff invited gay and lesbian activists to the White House in error, and that Bush did not endorse the lifestyle of all groups attending ceremony. The protesters carried signs with slogans such as fundamentally lesbian, and all people with AIDS are innocent. At one point, demonstrators took over the park stage shouting down speakers from NGO 90 and cutting a microphone cord. ACT UP argued that fundamentalist opposition to homosexuality creates obstacles in the fight against AIDS. They also reacted to a go 90 letter that promoted quote, spiritual warfare at the city's gates of sin. To go 90 spokesman said that while he doesn't approve of homosexuality himself, the group's literature does not mention it and that their spiritual warfare targets evil spirits, not people. Reaction to the turf conflict has divided the gay community and caused some questioning of both act UPS organizing and the demonstrators behavior at the event.

Lesbians gays and supporters braved 90 degree heat to attend a march and rally organized as a show of lesbian and gay pride and strength in the face of police brutality, which took place two weeks before when police raided a private party for gays and lesbians that was taking place in a loft located in a downtown non residential area. Some say police came because beer was allegedly being sold illegally, while others speculate that police saw people entering and leaving the building and became suspicious. But to date, the reason for the raid remains unclear. Lisa harden of lesbians and gays against violence explains what happens next.

When people started to leave the party approximately 4am They were confronted with 30 Police. There was just a lot of provocation and harassment of the people leaving the party and it escalated with the police attacking people with their batons, throwing people on the ground chasing them down the sidewalk with their police cars. The night after the party gays and lesbians staged a sit in in a downtown area known as the Gay Village. This demonstration ended peacefully. The following afternoon, a picket was held in front of police station 25 Well, three representatives from the lesbian and gay community met with police officials. No progress was made at this time, and demonstrators then blocked the street by holding a sit in and kiss in this time police in riot gear attack the demonstrators brutally beating them even though they did not resist. On both occasions. Police officers attacking party goers or demonstrators removed their identification badges and did not immediately inform those they detained whether they were under arrest to clear violations of department policy. These two violent confrontations resulted in a total of 58 arrests and 125 injured 22 of whom required subsequent medical treatment. Why are you here today?
