BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Did I tell you I was interested?

BRIAN Did I tell you I was going to New York next week?

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: No, Brian, you didn't.

BRIAN I didn't.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Why you going to New York?

BRIAN Well, you handed me this here, red piece of paper with a heart on, and it said, sweetheart, and reminded me of

BRADLEY: Valentine's day.

SCOTT LEWIS: On my birthday.

BRIAN On your birthday, well, girl, I'm glad I'd be in New York. I'm going for your birthday. No.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Bitch.

BRIAN You know, I never watch TV, not even when I'm on it.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Right.

BRIAN This new program, Rolonda Watts.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Right.

BRIAN I had never heard of her before. And--

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: She used to be on *Attitude* on Lifetime.

BRIAN Well, girl, she called me and asked me to be on her show.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Did she?

BRIAN Mm-hmm, so I'm a fly up on the 13th. We're going to film on the 14th. And I don't know when it's going to air,
BRADLEY: probably, a week or so after that. They're going to have cuts of *Philadelphia* in it. So I would imagine they're going to air it sometime soon.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, what are you going to talk about?

BRIAN HIV discrimination. You know, I did file my lawsuit against University of Texas M.D. Anderson with supreme court.
BRADLEY: So as *Philadelphia* is out, and you know attention is being put on all these fictitious people that have had crap done to them from, you know-- because they have HIV.

SCOTT LEWIS: Brian and Rolonda are going to bring it to the forefront that there are real people behind the scenes.

BRIAN No, that's right. And Kim Bergalis is still dead. So she won't be on it.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Did you see-- you have a special interest-- I ain't going to touch it. I ain't going to touch it. What do you think about Kim Bergalis being dead? 526 KPFT 5265738.

BRIAN I say that--
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Would you jump out of a plane, give us a call and talk about it. We'll put you on the air.

BRIAN Kim, would you jump out of a plane.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Kim Bergalis, if you're listening and would jump out of a plane, call us at 526 KPFT 526578. Girl, we have-- we have breached-- we have breached the boundaries of tasteless now.

BRIAN Oh, no, when I was on Oprah Winfrey, Kim Bergalis was on there. And I just got sick of it, and her mother too.
BRADLEY: That's that was my point. She will not be on. [LAUGHS]

SCOTT LEWIS: You know, and Kim Bergalis, like, on Rolonda tonight, we have Brian Bradley.

BRIAN And there goes Kim Bergalis.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And from the grave, Kim Bergalis, who's presently jumping out of a plane. Kim, can you hear us? Anyway, you know, we have stretched the limits of tastelessness at this point.

BRIAN That dress you have on did that.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: We've probably gone well beyond the Jeff arm thing that's raised such a stir in the in the right wing of our community. Do--

BRIAN Excuse me, I'm having a little tuberculosis attack.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yes, our community does have a right wing. Do you not believe it? 5265738 526 KPFT. I don't think they're going to call. National Gay and Lesbian Organization urges re-election of Craig Washington to congress.

BRIAN I know that's right.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: The Human Rights Campaign Fund has endorsed Craig Washington over--

BRIAN Sheila Jackson Lee.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Now, why do you think that is?

BRIAN It is because Craig Washington is one of the few persons in congress out of 435 men and women who have a

BRADLEY: 100% voting record on gay and lesbian and HIV issues.

SCOTT LEWIS: Isn't he one of two?

BRIAN One of two.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: One of two.

BRIAN Our gay congressmen, count them, one, two, don't have as good of a voting record on our issues as Craig

BRADLEY: Washington.

SCOTT LEWIS: Every gay lesbian and gay American has an interest in keeping Craig Washington in congress. He is more than a supporter of our cause. He is a champion. That's a quote from Tim McFeely, the executive director of the campaign fund. He continues, Congressman Washington has repeatedly gone the extra mile in support of civil rights for lesbian and gay Americans and for increased funding for our health care concerns.

Congressman Washington is a co-sponsor of the federal lesbian and gay civil rights bill and strongly supported the effort to lift the ban on lesbian and gay personnel in the military. He has earned-- excuse me, he has earned a 100% voting record from the campaign fund throughout his years in congress. We are proud to have been an early backer of Congressman Washington when he first sought federal office. And we look forward to providing him with strong support in his re-election effort to working closely with him in the years to come.

BRADLEY: every man and woman has the right to go out and file for office, and run, and be elected to the office, or be defeated. So, you know, I take my hat off to anybody that's got the courage and the stick to it to be in the political process and run. Because it's a very arduous thing. So, you know, good luck to her that way.

SCOTT LEWIS: But--

BRIAN But we going to keep praying.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Brian and I-- but Brian and I here tonight are personally endorsing, along with the Human Rights Campaign Fund, Craig Washington.

BRIAN That's going to guarantee him a victory right there.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I don't know but if somebody could pass me some sunglasses, I think I might be doing a little better.

JIMMY CARPER: Jealous. Jealous Queens.

BRIAN Jealous of what? My teeth are my own. My hair's my own and not because I paid for it because it grew out of my
BRADLEY: scalp.

SCOTT LEWIS: But can we talk about the parts of your anatomy that are plastic.

BRIAN No.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Can we talk about your personality that is plastic?

BRIAN Quit making that noise over there. People trying to sleep.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you-- people are trying to sleep, not listening to us, queen. You want me to play this song. What is it?

BRIAN This is the requested music by the Pet Shop Boy. Dedicate this.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: To who?

BRIAN To Kim.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: To Kim. To Kim Bergalis. Is it go-- go?

BRIAN Tell it on the mountain.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is it "Go South"?

JIMMY CARPER: No, it's not.

SCOTT LEWIS: It's number nine, "To Speak is a Sin." Have you heard this song because, you know, some-- some-- this is probably the same queen that called in and asked me to play "The Theater" and I did. Honey, it sucked. Is this-- have you heard this song? Is it any good?

BRIAN I thought that's what theater was for.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: It is OK?

JIMMY CARPER: Yes.

SCOTT LEWIS: Theater's for sucking. Well, BRIAN BRADLEY--

BRIAN Play the song.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And we'll talk about that off the air. This is number nine for the guy that called in.

[MUSIC PLAYING]

[AUDIO OUT]

[MUSIC PLAYING]

Whoo, yeah, that didn't suck at all.

BRIAN [SUCKING]

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Updating the news now, McKinney and Walker are closed between Louisiana and Bagby. And Kimberly Bergalis is still dead. This is Scott Lewis and Brian Bradley on *After Hours*, a continuing tradition on KPFK Houston 90.1 FM. You know, Brian?

BRIAN I know.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I know that you do.

BRIAN Hate crimes.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Have you seen this?

BRIAN Hate crime.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Have you seen-- did you read this little article?

BRIAN Yeah.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Did you know that the first-- the first potential parolee is up in the Paul Broussard case.

BRIAN Yes, ma'am, I already have the petitions written. People can call me at home, 7484124.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Now, that you've already done that I don't know that it's a wise idea for you to give your phone number out over the air. Kimberly Bergalis might call.

BRIAN Oh, that's right. I just heard in the news that she's still dead.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And Francisco Franco is still also. But now, I mean this is a real serious-- serious topic here. You have been intimately and very profoundly involved in litigating the 10 defendants in the Paul Broussard murder. The 10 convicted murders have finally all been adjudicated at this process. And it's not-- at this point, and it's not been too long since the last one of those guys, Paul Chance Dillon, got his sentence.

Well, here we go now. The first one is up and eligible for parole, ironically, on the date of Paul's death, July the 4th. But the process starts now. But we can do something about that. We can talk to the folks at the pardons and paroles board. And we can petition them. They have a very long address. I won't say what it is now and expect people to write it down. It's very long.

But if you're sincerely interested in keeping those folks in jail, call me at 7484124. Just leave on my machine that-- that you want the address and leave a number and I'll call you back. But Javier Aguirre is up for parole. And the other two defendants that got 15 years also are going to be eligible real soon. These SOBs instead of the other words--

BRIAN I think you can say it, can't you?

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Can I say bastards?

JIMMY CARPER: Yeah.

BRIAN Well, you just did.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: These three bastards who got 15 years in one day for the premeditated cold blooded murder of another human being have served less than a year and now the officials see fit to give them an opportunity to be let go.

BRIAN Oh, it's just crazy.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: So we need to write the Texas department of health. I mean, here I'm all still in this thing, the Texas Department of Corrections and see that it is delayed a little bit.

BRIAN Have you heard about this place, Exclusive Tanning?
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Actually, one of the television news deals had something on it not too long ago, not on this one particularly, but on the whole idea of tanning salons now and what they are.

BRIAN Well, this is-- it's kind of not a normal tanning salon, get your finger ready.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Normal?

BRIAN This is not normal at all. You can get live one-on-one male models over here at this place, at Exclusive Tanning.
BRADLEY: Now, rumor has it--

SCOTT LEWIS: So when you went, what did you see? You look an awful pale to me, you ain't been in no tanning booth.

BRIAN Well, rumor has it that when you have a live one-on-one male model you don't spend a whole lot of time in the
BRADLEY: tanning booth.

SCOTT LEWIS: Mm-hmm.

BRIAN Allegedly.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Allegedly. I don't know what exactly you would do with a live model--

BRIAN It's my understanding that they model for you--
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Where the booth--

BRIAN With no clothes on.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Where the bed is.

BRIAN You know, you said--
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: This boy in this picture is not wearing much clothes. It's a little towel.

BRIAN Well, he looks like he's from Iowa somewhere.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And I saw a whole big full page ad in the Houston voice a few weeks back where you could get two on one male models. And they have female models.

BRIAN Excuse me--

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And male and male models.

BRIAN You mean two for one, or two on one?

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Two-- two-- well from what I hear it's two on one, allegedly. Well, I mean that's what the ad says. Save \$20 on a session with the best looking guys in Houston with this coupon. Just one of the hot male models waiting to serve you.

BRIAN What do they serve you? Tea and crumpets?

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, yeah. Pancakes.

BRIAN I don't know but this sounds to me-- well, you know, I don't have a problem with all this because here we live in
BRADLEY: the age of AIDS, and other sexually transmitted diseases, and still we have this strong puritan ethic running through our society. And hypocrisy runs rampant. I mean, I know what this is. You get a male model. He's there for your viewing pleasure, and whatever else you might find to do with yourself is between you and no one else, including this person here. Hey, it's pretty safe to me.

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I just want to know, how come I haven't been over-- invited over for like a personal megastar tour, you know.

BRIAN Well, I understand Roseanne Barr has the couch occupied right now. When she's off of it, you can have it.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: I mean I want these people need to call me up and say, you know, come over for a special megastars tour, special megastars two on one session and then you could talk about it on your megastar radio show. And that's what I'm upset about. However, I understand-- my understanding is that the person that models for you and you do whatever you want to do is your own business might go a little further than that. But I don't know that that is of course, allegedly.

BRIAN Allegedly. That word has saved me more than once on this show. And that's because big brother is listening and
BRADLEY: he has a tape recorder. OK, did you read this? Michael Crawford is doing an outrage and people-- what's the name of the other group?

SCOTT LEWIS: United--

BRIAN United--

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: People of Color or some--

SCOTT LEWIS: People of Color United, I think.

BRIAN Well, go and talk, I'll find the name of it.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: They're protesting president Clinton tomorrow at--

BRIAN The Wortham Center.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: At the Wortham Center. Clinton's going to be here for-- isn't it a thousand dollar a plate?

BRIAN For Democratic National Committee. No, it's \$10,000 per person fundraiser.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is that what it is?

BRIAN Yeah, it's benefiting the Texas Democratic Party and the National Democratic Party. Cisneros, Benson, various

BRADLEY: other people are going to be there, the governor Lloyd Benson. You know, Clinton is not George Bush. He's not that bad. He's done some good things for us. We expect good things out of him in the future. However, he's shown a great willingness to compromise on fundamental things. And I think it's only appropriate that folks keep his feet to the fire as they did Bush and Reagan.

SCOTT LEWIS: It says here they will call on President Clinton to enact the recommendations of the national commission on AIDS which urge a more coordinated response to the epidemic and the passage of the AIDS cure act. That bill recently introduced in congress would centralize AIDS funding in the United States and remove it from federal control. They also will demand the complete elimination of the ban on gay men and lesbians serving in the armed forces. The passage of an equal rights bill outlawing discrimination against gays and lesbians and the adoption of a single payer system of national health insurance.

BRIAN And I don't see any reason in the world that that can't be all done by Monday.

BRADLEY:

BRIAN This ain't it.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: You need to turn to the left. Nancy Ford, who's--

BRIAN The queen of all things lesbian.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: --the director of *After Hours* at KPFT.

JIMMY CARPER: Since when?

BRIAN Since she became queen of all things lesbian.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Since this memo came from the new counseling center. Somebody needs to call Bill Scott.

BRIAN He's in New York.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is he?

BRIAN Yeah.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, Bill, pick up the clue phone because--

BRIAN My goodness, it's a minor mistake. Get over it.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I look like Nancy Ford, that's what the deal is.

BRIAN Poor Nancy. Poor, poor Nancy.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Nancy and I do look a lot alike. But I don't have that red hair anymore.

JIMMY CARPER: She's got the better wardrobe.

BRIAN I was at, over there--

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, because--

BRIAN --over at the *Uptown Express* office today. And there was like Barbie dolls everywhere.

BRADLEY:

JIMMY CARPER: Whoa, what's the deal?

BRIAN Well, the current issue of *Uptown Express* has a picture of Barbie and Ken on it. And next month's edition will

BRADLEY: have a picture of me on it, but anyway. Barbie dolls everywhere.

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, they can't be attractive men and women every month. Oh, oh, get your boot out of my-- anyway--

BRIAN Was that your anyway? Do you ever feel-- do you-- do you feel like that Jimmy is in here playing like he's

BRADLEY: rearranging his CD file and--

SCOTT LEWIS: But he's watching us.

BRIAN Yeah.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Making sure we don't say anything that big brother wouldn't like.

BRIAN No, you know, I feel a certain sense of security and comfort having him here. You know, it's always beneficial to

BRADLEY: have an older presence to monitor things.

SCOTT LEWIS: You know, there's--

BRIAN Experience is valuable.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, he does have it.

JIMMY CARPER: And with me here, it takes that load off your shoulders, doesn't it Brian?

BRIAN He chose, [? he'll do ?]. Thank you, Mary. How many little old women went blind sewing them sequins on that

BRADLEY: vest--

JIMMY CARPER: Hey, I don't care.

BRIAN --you got on. You don't care. Spoken like a true queen. Liberace is not dead.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: But Kimberly Bergalis is.

BRIAN That's the new program we're can do about famous people we know who are dead who died of AIDS. Rock

BRADLEY: Hudson, Liberace, Kim Bergalis. The list goes on and on.

SCOTT LEWIS: Arthur Ashe.

BRIAN Arthur Ashe.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Kim Bergalis.

BRIAN Kim--

BRADLEY:

[LAUGHTER]

SCOTT LEWIS: Michael Callen.

BRIAN My dog spot.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Kim Bergalis.

BRIAN Did you hear about the play that they did about Kim Bergalis?

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is that the one where she dies of AIDS at the end?

[LAUGHTER]

And her family paid a million dollars to get it written or something.

BRIAN Oh, we're going to-- did you dedicate that song to me earlier? "Queer in a Black Leather Jacket."

BRADLEY:

JIMMY CARPER: I did.

BRIAN I didn't hear it.

BRADLEY:

JIMMY CARPER: Oh.

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, Alma, check your battery. We're going to go to this-- what's this song called we're getting ready to play?

JIMMY CARPER: "I want to Watch Cartoons."

BRIAN No, but it's dedicated to you, honey.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: What's it called?

BRIAN Play it and see.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: This is dedicated to us.

[MUSIC PLAYING]

BRIAN Mm-hmm. That do bring back some memories from Memphis Tennessee back when I was a mere slip of a girl.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, well that would have been right after the Louisiana purchase, right?

BRIAN Just prior to the civil war.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Dirk, are you there?

DIRK: Yes, I'm here.

SCOTT LEWIS: You're on the air. You just got out of the air force.

DIRK: Yeah, about a year ago. Actually, it was almost exactly a year ago.

SCOTT LEWIS: And what was that like?

DIRK: Well, the air force I liked for a while.

BRIAN What was the sex like, Dirk? Just tell me because, you know, they tell me that the air force is just full of queens

BRADLEY: and it's just sex galore, not to be confused with the drag queen sex galore.

DIRK: Well, gee, I must have missed it all because I didn't see any.

SCOTT LEWIS: No?

BRIAN Well, you should have opened your eyes.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Well, I was in the out coming process.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, OK. Well are you out now?

DIRK: Well, not completely, not yet. I'm working on it.

BRIAN Is Dirk your real name?

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: It is.

BRIAN Like Dirk Bogarde.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Close enough.

BRIAN OK, well, you know, who that is, don't you? He's an old dead actor, who did not die of Aids by the way, Scott.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: But Kimberly Bergalis did.

BRIAN Kimberly Bergalis did.

BRADLEY:

[LAUGHTER]

SCOTT LEWIS: So, Dirk, you have opinions on Bill Clinton, as I'm sure everyone does.

DIRK: Yeah, I really didn't want him to be elected.

BRIAN Oh, Dirk, please don't be a republican.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: No, I'm not even close to a republican.

BRIAN Well, thank you, go right ahead.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: I'm independent.

BRIAN I can tell that in your voice.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Oh, really.

BRIAN Yeah.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: And I didn't think he was going to be able to do what he said. And most of his promises have, you know, typical politician stuff.

BRIAN And Dirk, you were right.
BRADLEY:

DIRK: I wish I wasn't. I really didn't want to be right. But the don't ask don't tell is, you know, even though it has set up some interesting laws, or interesting loopholes in the laws, is still kind of hard on those of us who are still in the military.

BRIAN You know what I say--
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you in the reserves now?

DIRK: Well, in active reserves.

SCOTT LEWIS: So you fly infrequently?

DIRK: Yeah, pretty much.

BRIAN You know, I say, don't ask, don't tell, don't swallow.
BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: And that's good.

DIRK: It's good advice.

SCOTT LEWIS: So, Dirk?

DIRK: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: Where were you at in the air force?

DIRK: I was in Sunnyvale, California. That was my last place. Onizuka Air Force Base.

SCOTT LEWIS: Mm-hmm.

DIRK: And that's when I actually started coming out. A straight friend of mine actually got me plastered and made me tell the whole story.

BRIAN Them straight boys do that all the time.
BRADLEY:

DIRK: Yeah, they like doing that. But then I started telling the rest of my friends I was gay or bi. And it's like none of them were even the least bit offended by it. And they like thought it was really interesting having a gay friend.

BRIAN Did they let you keep one of the airplanes?
BRADLEY:

DIRK: No, I tucked it away in one of my duffel bags on the way home.

BRIAN And I bet you got a cute duffel bag.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Oh, yes, ugly green.

BRIAN Oh, I hope no diabetics are listening. Dirk?

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Yes.

BRIAN This isn't the dating game, hon. Look at you, you're getting all geared up.

BRADLEY:

DIRK: Oh.

BRIAN Well, I just happen to be behind door number two tonight. And we're giving the--

BRADLEY:

[LAUGHTER]

We're giving-- I know a lot about the military. Hup, two, three, four, and all this. You remember I was in the military myself sort of.

SCOTT LEWIS: Yes, sort of. You were a military wife.

BRIAN Oh, yes I was. Doug-- Doug.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: You can't even remember his frigging name.

BRIAN Contestant number one.

BRADLEY:

SCOTT LEWIS: Did you have a military wife, so to speak?

BRIAN If you were a lollipop, what flavor would you be?

BRADLEY:

DIRK: I don't think--

BRIAN And can't say, cherry.

BRADLEY:

[LAUGHTER]

DIRK: Root beer.

BRIAN And why root beer, Dirk?

BRADLEY:

DIRK: I just like the sound of it.
