Glow radio seeks to reach people beyond the gay Mecca has with timely queer community voices said John McMullen General Manager planted out broadcasting. We have also created a forum in which gay and lesbian broadcasting talent create new kinds of programming without the previously prohibited costs associated with traditional broadcasting. This platform lets us incubate new talent, and takes risks that would be impossible to do otherwise. Traditionally, gay and lesbian people have been invisible on mainstream radio shows, stations. Now the Internet offers a way to reach people in markets without gay and lesbian coverage, as well as cities with large gay and lesbian broadcasting populations.
