make sure that you're informed about the risks, and that you protect yourself against them. And that's all we ask, you know, no biggie, have as much sex as you want. It's not boring. They're really fun, especially when we break out the toys and you know, in the in the actual sex workshops, but the stuff we're talking about is really relevant to any young and older, gay man's life. We're not judgmental, you know, like I said, do whatever you want, we, you know, all of us do, we all have our own thing. Just make sure that as an adult making an adult decision to have sex, that you make adult choices about what risk you're taking, and learn to protect yourselves. Not only yourself, but the people that you love, if you have a partner at home, a boyfriend or are you doing something on the slide and think about how the other person would feel if both of you came down with something, maybe not HIV, but maybe a case of crabs try explaining that, you know, or hepatitis. That kind of ruins it. Yeah, you know, where do you get the crabs from? Oh. Think not? Well, I saw that.

So something like that with intimacy and relationship issues really isn't mandated towards negative or positive men, you know, we don't try drop something like think negative, which is a HIV negative men's group, then obviously, that would be for HIV negative men, which is really the only one that we have the safer sex issues, and workshops and all the things that come up about that in all the workshops, there is stuff about safer sex in all of the workshops. That's for everybody.
