And there may be fresh injuries on his hands from an assault he allegedly committed earlier Tuesday up and Tyler and Mr. Froman could be driving a stolen 1987 Two Door maroon Oldsmobile with Texas tags B eight seven B x C. And it's a vehicle of that description that had been stolen from a manufacturing plant around 3am On Tuesday morning of the assault and robbery at a hotel, night clerk and in Tyler. He was last seen in Tyler where he had been living since February 28. And on March 9, he allegedly attacked and robbed a 35 year old female night clerk employee of the Tyler Ramada Inn, where he lived and worked as a maintenance man. His Mo is that he trades sexual favors or money or for crack cocaine. He preys on gay men, and he usually that he usually meets in social settings such as gay bar. He has no age preference for his victims. But he prefers transient relationship. He may stay with someone for two or three days mooch off them and then move on after he's robbed him and he's already killed. Now when you go to a Federal Penitentiary, you do the whole you do the whole nickel. There's no There's no parole. How long will this become a federal case on a charge of felon of a felon in possession of a firearm? Now this is what the Galveston Daily News is reporting. And Stephanie was accused of shooting the home of a gay man back in May of 98. A year ago, witnesses told police that Stephanie had accosted a group of gay men who were standing at 44th Street and Wall Street and Stephanie threatened one of the men and told them to leave the area. But when Stephanie slapped one of the men, the man responded by flattening Stephanie with a single punch. Stephanie went home and got a pistol and shot several times at the home with a man who had punched him. A day later, please work in a federal community. Policing grant spotted Stephanie in the palm terrace area and arrested him after they discovered he had a pistol. The gun proved to be the one used in the shooting. police charged Stephanie with deadly conduct and with being a felon in possession of a firearm, but dropped the charges so US attorneys could prosecute him on a federal weapons possession charge. So he goes to the federal penitentiary and does a whole nickel on that one. The James Byrd Hate Crime Act, also known as House Bill 938 was overwhelmingly endorsed by dozens of speakers including Berges younger sister Lavon Harris and numerous civil religious and gay rights leaders, house judiciary, Judicial Affairs Committee voted to pass the bill into the full House by a margin of 62.
