**BRUCE:** Yay. [INAUDIBLE]

**TERRY:** Yeah, thank you.

**HOST 2:** So we're going. We're moving.

**BRUCE:** Give us a call at 520--

**HOST 2:** --5738. 520-KPFT.

**HOST 1:** Yeah.

**HOST 2:** And pick up on your wonderful premiums.

**MAN:** (SINGING) Come out of the closet and love me. Come out of the closet. Be free. Come, come, come, come, come out of the closet. Come, come, come. I know it's dark in there. So come out, come out, with a scream and shout, and see everybody everywhere.

**HOST 1:** Boom, boom, boom. What were you saying?

**CINDY:** I said sometimes I freeze up when I see this microphone.

**MICHAEL:** It don't bite.

**HOST 1:** There's nothing to be afraid of--

**CINDY:** It just nibbles?

**HOST 1:** --is there, Michael?

**CINDY:** It could be a turn on, huh?

**HOST 1:** Cindy's one of our phone volunteer answering people out in the lobby, right?

**CINDY:** And if you call in, you talk to me.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738. 520-KPFT. Your husband-- you and your husband are down here all the time. Why?

**CINDY:** Yeah, we do. Because we think it's a good cause. We support free speech and free radio.

**HOST 1:** And that's what KPFT is all about, right?

**CINDY:** We don't take any corporate funds, and we don't have to play anything that we don't want to.

**HOST 1:** That's right. We can play just about anything we want to when we come in here, right?

**CINDY:** Except the seven deadly words.

**HOST 1:** We can play those. We play them backwards.

**CINDY:** [LAUGHS] That's true.

**HOST 1:** So you're down here at 3:00 in the morning answering telephones.

**CINDY:** Mm-hmm.

**HOST 1:** The number is 520-5738, 520-KPFT.

**CINDY:** Those pledges can be anonymous, also.

**HOST 1:** Right, and you don't have to be gay or lesbian to call in during this time, as that's what Cindy and I were talking about, right? Because you and your husband are strong supporters in what KPFT stands for, which means you're strong supporters of human rights everywhere. And we just wanted to say thanks for coming down and helping us answer the phones.

**CINDY:** Well, we get a lot of it back.

**HOST 1:** OK, thanks Cindy. What are you doing out there?

**HOST 2:** Well, we're waiting for the phones to ring. We're still stuck at \$118 here. We'd like to hear from you.

**MIKE:** We're reading a wonderful story about a 2,000-year-old man that was found inside a tree.

**HOST 1:** 2000-year-old man.

**HOST 2:** Wearing a watch that still ticks.

[PHONE RINGS]

**MIKE:** It's John Cameron Swayze.

**HOST 2:** Phone's ringing.

**HOST 1:** John Cameron Swayze was found inside of a tree.

**HOST 2:** There's a phone.

**HOST 1:** The phone can't ring because Cindy's in here.

**HOST 2:** Oh, it just rang once.

**CINDY:** We have other people.

**HOST 2:** Somebody was just seeing if the phone number worked. It works. I can guarantee it works. There, we've got-- we've got other people here. Listen.

**CINDY:** We have plenty of people to answer the phone.

**HOST 2:** Yeah, I'm out here waiting for your call, folks.

**HOST 1:** Who is that?

**TERRY:** It sounds like Susie Q.

**HOST 1:** Susie Q.

**HOST 2:** Susie Q.

[PHONE RINGS]

**HOST 1:** It's Terry's [INAUDIBLE].

**HOST 2:** Uh-oh. There it goes again.

**TERRY:** That's my other half.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738, 520-KPFT. For a \$68 pledge, you can pick up that cooler.

**HOST 2:** For a \$38 pledge, you can get a T-shirt.

**HOST 1:** And for \$128 pledge, you can get loyal-- I can't even say that, loyal-- loyal-- loyal-- somebody say loyal--

**TERRY:** Loyal.

**HOST 1:** --listener beach bum club package, which includes a beach bag--

**MICHAEL:** [LAUGHS] Beach bum.

**HOST 1:** --and a beach towel. And we might even throw in Clay as the beach bum.

**TERRY:** Yay. Go ahead, Clay.

**HOST 2:** And if you really want to get into it, for \$218, you get a beach bag, the towel, the cooler, the T-shirt, and the program guide subscription for a year.

**HOST 1:** And we'll throw just about anything else in you ask for right now, especially at this hour.

**TERRY:** Even Bruce. Take him. Take him, please.

**BRUCE:** There's some trash in here we can throw in.

**HOST 2:** We'd have to ask for a \$300 pledge for Bruce. He's tall. He's 6' 5".

**BRUCE:** And hairy.

**TERRY:** And hairy too.

**HOST 1:** 6' 5" and--

[LAUGHTER]

[PHONE RINGS]

OK, 520-5738. There's a \$300 pledge on the line right there.

**HOST 2:** Uh-oh, Bruce, we're going to have to give you away.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738, 520-KPFT Make it to Visa, American Express, or MasterCard.

**HOST 2:** Call now.

**HOST 1:** Yeah, call now.

**HOST 2:** (WHISPERING) 520-5738, 520-KPFT.

[PHONE RINGS]

[MUSIC PLAYING]

**HOST 1:** Only on KPFT, right?

**BRUCE:** That's right. Faggot and dyke radio.

**HOST 1:** Faggot and dyke radio, well at least on Sunday mornings from 2:00 to 4:00. What's going on Monday, Lloyd?

**LLOYD:** Oh, Monday night 8:00 PM, the location is heaven. The question is, what's it worth? What's it worth to have the 1988 Lesbian Gay Pride Week? What's it worth to have a parade? What's it worth to you to be able to walk down Westheimer holding your lover's hand? What's it worth just to be able to come out, and to be gay, to be a lesbian?

And just in answer to this, one of our answers to this, the 1988 Lesbian Gay Pride Week Finance Committee is sponsoring an evening of auction and entertainment, entertainment to be provided by name Naomi Sims, Donna Day, Miss Alicia, Cathy Reiser.

**HOST 1:** Did you just say Naomi Sims?

**LLOYD:** Naomi Sims, Yes.

**HOST 1:** Oh, wonderful.

**LLOYD:** The lovely. And also, the Texas Lovin Cloggers, Randy Job will be there. We're going to be auctioning items that have been donated by people like Gump's, Neiman Marcus, I.W. Marks, Lobo.

**HOST 1:** Oh, wait a minute. Wait a minute. Wait a minute.

**LLOYD:** Oh.

**HOST 1:** Wait a minute.

**LLOYD:** I'm sorry.

**HOST 1:** You're having a gay and lesbian auction, and you got stuff donated by Neiman Marcus--

**LLOYD:** Let me tell you something.

**HOST 1:** --and Gump's down in the Galleria?

**LLOYD:** Think I-45 North.

**HOST 1:** Between Tidwell and Parker?

**TERRY:** Save--

**ALL:** --you money!

**LLOYD:** Yay. [LAUGHS] Well, he's got to help us make money. That's right.

**HOST 1:** Is he going to be there?

**LLOYD:** I'm not sure. He had planned to, but I think he's got another engagement that evening.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738.

**LLOYD:** But we've already got one of his recliners.

**HOST 1:** 520-KPFT is the number to call.

**BRUCE:** That sounds like fun.

**HOST 1:** Yeah, a recliner?

**BRUCE:** Yeah.

**HOST 1:** Oh, God.

**BRUCE:** [LAUGHS]

**TERRY:** Bruce, hold yourself back, baby.

**HOST 1:** Bruce, I don't know what happened to him--

**TERRY:** It's OK, Bruce.

**HOST 1:** --but he's just kicked into sex mode.

**BRUCE:** Can I say hi to Terry?

**HOST 2:** No.

**BRUCE:** And if he's listening, call me.

**TERRY:** Call Bruce.

**BRUCE:** 526 -4000

**HOST 2:** Make a pledge, Terry. We won't let you talk to Bruce unless you make a pledge.

**BRUCE:** OK, then call 520-5738.

**HOST 2:** 520-KPFT.

**HOST 1:** And if you can't make a pledge, if you're one of the hundreds of listeners that join us every week that, for some reason or another, because mom and dad are sleeping, or because your teacher is going to find out, because your pastor's going to find out, or because you're afraid somebody's going to find out, call us at 526-4000 and just let us know that you're listening.

Also, we have an album to give away for you that's absolutely bad. I swear to God it is.

**BRUCE:** That bad, huh?

**HOST 1:** It says it is right here on the cover, bad.

**BRUCE:** Bad. In red letters, no less.

**HOST 1:** It's the new Michael Jackson album. And it's got-- well, the song "Man in the Mirror" is nice. It really is. It's a nice song. God, she looks pretty on the cover, doesn't she?

**BRUCE:** Doesn't she?

**CLAY:** Yes, she does.

**BRUCE:** She even puts Miss Newman to shame.

**HOST 1:** This is a new copy of *Bad*, new Michael Jackson album, 526-4000. You can play it on your stereo. You can run over it with your car. If you're the first one to call us and say give me that record, we'll give it to you.

**BRUCE:** What happened? The phones rang.

**HOST 2:** They're ringing. It sounds like someone is playing around with the phones.

**BRUCE:** Well, somebody's playing around with the phones. Somebody's calling and--

**HOST 1:** If you want to play around on this show, and come down, and be a part of it-- get that out of here, Clay. He's got something-- well, I can't tell you what he's holding in his hand.

**BRUCE:** Hard No. [LAUGHS]

**HOST 1:** If you want to-- if you want to come down and be a part of this show, you can call us at the ~~the~~*AfterHours* hotline. That number is area code 713-529-4636, and we'll put you on the show. We're booked up until about August, I think. We've got a lot of wonderful things happening for you. We've got some gay history for you in May and June.

**HOST 2:** (WHISPERING) 520-5738.

**HOST 1:** And we've got Mark Timmers coming on June the 5th. Mark's an ex-Houston police officer. And, no, we're not having an affair and never have had an affair. I don't know who started that vicious rumor. I'd like to have an affair with him, but--

**TERRY:** Oh.

**BRUCE:** Who wouldn't?

**HOST 1:** Anyway, Mark's going to come on, and talk about growing up gay, and what it was like to be a cop. And we're not going to say anything nasty about the police department because there's not--

**BRUCE:** We're not?

**HOST 1:** Well, there's nothing nasty to say. Most of those folks down there are good people. In fact, we support the cop's project over on Westheimer. It's going to be part of our parade theme this year.

**BRUCE:** Keep our police station.

**HOST 1:** Yeah, and we need that police station. I was glad to see the guys down there this morning because at least we can get to the radio station now on Sunday.

**TERRY:** Yes.

**BRUCE:** All those little orange pylons in the middle of the street, it's wonderful.

**HOST 1:** [INAUDIBLE]

**HOST 2:** I went down there a couple of weeks ago, and it was like [SINGS TWILIGHT ZONE THEME]. You have entered--

**MIKE:** It was almost frightening.

**HOST 2:** --*The Twilight Zone*.

**HOST 1:** What was that?

**BRUCE:** But we don't have any horses anymore.

**HOST 2:** [SINGS TWILIGHT ZONE THEME]

**HOST 1:** Normally, around 3 o' clock--

**HOST 2:** Oh, Bruce. You and the horses.

**HOST 1:** Normally, around 3:00 in the morning, we have Brian Keever come in and do the news, but, Brian, we couldn't find him. We were all just pretty zapped because of the quilt project.



**TERRY:** [INAUDIBLE]

**HOST 1:** And Brian didn't get the news for us. We do have Bobby Miller, our new sports director, standing by to come in and give you the mantra of sports in just a couple of minutes. Should we do something to get people to pledge? Call in?

**BRUCE:** Well, we could try.

**HOST 1:** What are we going to do?

**TERRY:** Please call in.

**BRUCE:** We've tried giving away my body. We haven't given yours away yet.

**HOST 1:** But I can't give mine away without having a marathon.

**TERRY:** I bet he has a hairy chest if you want to feel Buddy's hairy chest.

**HOST 1:** I can't give my body away--

**HOST 3:** Terry.

**HOST 1:** --when it's not marathon, so forget--

**BRUCE:** We could give Terry's body away.

**TERRY:** Oh, please.

**BRUCE:** [INAUDIBLE] hairy chest?

**TERRY:** My hairy chest?

**BRUCE:** Sue's in the lobby.

**HOST 1:** Sue's out there in the lobby. 520-5738, 520-KPFT. Put your pledge on Visa, American Express, Mastercard. Pick up a wonderful premium. The premium, by the way-- the pledge, rather, by the way, doesn't have to be played-- played-- we're playing music.

**BRUCE:** Paid.

**HOST 1:** Paid. We pay pledges. Your pledge does not have to be paid all at one whack, either. If you want to make \$128 pledge and pick up the loyal listener beach bum club package, you can make that \$128 pledge and pay it out in payments, right?

**BRUCE:** That's it.

**HOST 1:** \$10 a month, \$5 a month, however you want to do it to let us know that you care about the radio station. And, baby, did somebody call about the Michael Jackson album because we saw the line?

**HOST 2:** Sure did.

**HOST 1:** The phone lit up. Did they really?

**HOST 2:** Sure did.

**HOST 1:** And who wanted that? Who picked that record up?

**HOST 2:** Sylvia Pipatoni.

**HOST 1:** Sylvia.

**TERRY:** All right, Sylvia.

**HOST 1:** Sylvia has a brand-new copy of the Michael Jackson *Bad* album. And it may be bad because it say so right here on the record.

**TERRY:** He be bad.

**HOST 1:** And, Sylvia, this album will be available here at the station on Monday. Well, in fact, you could come by, I guess, today and pick it up if you're around KPFT.

**TERRY:** Come by now.

**HOST 1:** No, it's early.

**HOST 2:** Yeah, after 7:00.

**HOST 1:** It's *AfterHours* on KPFT.

**HOST 2:** Between 7:00 and midnight.

**HOST 1:** 90.1 FM. But, Sylvia, we'll leave this out for you. It's the brand-new Michael Jackson album, and thank you so much for listening. Again, if you can't make a pledge of \$128, or 90.1, \$90.10, you can pledge \$5, \$10, whatever it takes to help get us to the goal.

**HOST 2:** \$18 and pick up on the guide for a year.

**HOST 1:** Yeah, \$18 will get you there. With the guide, you can find out all the wonderful stuff that's going to happen on KPFT, just like the Lesbian and Gay Pride Parade, which will be broadcast to you live by Jack and Ray. Well, Ray will be out in the parade.

**BRUCE:** Ray will be in the parade. Jack's going to be up there.

**HOST 1:** Jack will be on top of Mary's with-- I don't know who he'll have up there this year. Sue Level was up there last year. Maybe we can get Sue back.

**BRUCE:** That would be nice.

**HOST 1:** Oh, I had to burp. I didn't want to burp on public radio.

**TERRY:** Excuse you.

**HOST 1:** I know.

**BRUCE:** And then you talk about it anyway. So you might as well have burped on the air.

**HOST 1:** And wait a minute. What's this? Let's find out what this is.

**BRUCE:** Oh, god. What's he doing now?

**MOJO NIXON:** This here is Mojo Nixon, man. I say send your cash now, man. Don't take it to the bank. Don't give it no real estate agents, man. Don't give it to no fools in three-piece suits. Right here at KPFT, they need your dough, they need your cash, they need your money.

Come on. Bring it in. Send it in. You can bring it over here. You can mail it. You can pledge it. They need your dimes, nickels, pennies, quarters, dollars, 30 dollar bills with Bill Graham's picture on them. **HOST 1:** Print me a few. Anyway, 3:26 in the morning, KPFT Pacifica Radio, 90.1 FM, KPFT Houston. 520-5738, 520-KPFT is the number to call.

**BRUCE:** Somebody answer the phone.

**HOST 1:** Pledge your support to not only this program but every program you hear--

**HOST 2:** My gosh. We've got two phones ringing.

**HOST 1:** --on KPFT. KPFT offices are open during a marathon from 7:00 AM in the morning until midnight every day. We're located in the Montrose at 419 Lovett, and it's a beautiful place to be. So let's go to something. What are we going to go to?

**MICHAEL:** [INAUDIBLE]

**BRUCE:** You want to hear the sports?

**HOST 1:** Sports? Yeah, we'll hear the sports with Bobby Miller coming up now *onAfterHours*.

[MUSIC - WANG CHUNG, "EVERYBODY HAVE FUN TONIGHT"]

**HOST 1:** --Linda Morales from the Gay Hispanic Unidos telling us in Español how wonderful Lesbian Gay Pride Week is going to be in 1998.

**WOMAN 3:** When do we want it?

**CROWD:** Now!

**WOMAN 3:** What do we want?

**CROWD:** Gay rights!

**WOMAN 3:** When do we want it?

**CROWD:** Now!

**HOST 1:** Hello.

**HOST 2:** Hello.

**HOST 1:** Hello.

**WOMAN 3:** When do we want them?

**HOST 1:** Hello. Hello.

**HOST 2:** Hello. Hello.

**HOST 1:** Yes? Do we have an update because we've only got, like, 25 minutes.

**HOST 2:** We have an update. Drum roll. Anonymous called in and pledged \$50.

**HOST 1:** Great.

**HOST 2:** And we had another pledge increase by \$90. So we're up to \$258.10.

**HOST 1:** Yay.

**TERRY:** All right.

[APPLAUSE]

**HOST 2:** If we had three \$68 pledges, we'd go over our goal today.

**BRUCE:** We need another \$142.

**HOST 2:** That's right.

**TERRY:** Call us. Call us.

**BRUCE:** It would be easy to do if we could get--

**HOST 2:** Oh, very.

**BRUCE:** --16 people.

**HOST 1:** How much do we need?

**BRUCE:** \$142.

**HOST 2:** Only \$142.

**BRUCE:** If we could get 14 people--

**HOST 1:** Go over our goal.

**BRUCE:** --call and give us \$10, that'd be great.

**HOST 1:** Oh, come on. We can do that in 25 minutes.

**HOST 2:** We can do it. Oh, I think we could get four people to call in for T-shirts, \$38.

**BRUCE:** That sounds good.

**HOST 2:** Yes. We just need four of you to call in \$38 pledges and pick up your T-shirts, and your program guides, and support this station--

**TERRY:** Help support us.



**HOST 2:** --and this program.

**HOST 1:** Support this show.

**HOST 2:** Yes.

**HOST 1:** Support what's going on here.

**BRUCE:** And you, too, can be a supporter. The listener that called in and increased that pledge by \$90 said that this was a great show. And I think it's the first time they've really listened to the show. And so it's nice to have you in our audience.

**HOST 2:** Well, the anonymous caller that called in \$50 said that he has only been listening for three weeks and already has supported us.

**HOST 1:** You mean somebody called back to up their pledge?

**HOST 2:** Yes.

**BRUCE:** That is just great.

**HOST 1:** Whoa.

**BRUCE:** Isn't that great?

[MUSIC PLAYING]

**HOST 1:** Hey, baby. Well, thank you, anonymous, and thank everyone for listening. And get on the phone right now at 520-5738, 520-KPFT. We're going to just kind of dance around the studio when we tell you about KPFT and *AfterHours*. *AfterHours* was born back in June or July of last year because we wanted to come down and share the love of the gay and lesbian community with you every week. And we know that you're there for us, and now we're asking for you to pick up the phone and make a pledge to the station.

**HOST 2:** Don't forget to tell them about the special way they can pledge if they're taping this show or they're afraid to call now or cannot call now.

**HOST 1:** Oh, that's right. If you cannot call now because mom and dad are listening, or somebody else might be listening that you're afraid, or you just don't want to call, you can call us at our business office, which is really located in a little corner in my house, which right now looks like a bomb went off in it.

**BRUCE:** Oh, it doesn't look that bad.

**HOST 1:** It looks horrible.

**BRUCE:** Roger cleaned it today.

**HOST 1:** Well, he did clean it up. But anyway, it's the *AfterHours* hotline. The number is area code 713-529-4636. And you can also call us at that number if you need information about things that you've heard on the show. You can call us about that number if you want to come down and be on this show. And if you'll make a \$68 pledge right now, not only will you pick up the regular premium, which is the navy blue cooler that holds a six pack of your goodies, and ice, and sandwiches, and all that stuff, you'll get the program guide. **HOST 1:** Yeah we're going to Dallas to hear Lynn Lavner. 520-5738, 520-KPFT. Make your pledge to Visa--

**TERRY:** Call us.

**HOST 1:** --Mastercard, or American Express. Let us know what you think about free--

**TERRY:** No, that's gay American Express.

**HOST 1:** --speech radio. Yeah, 520-5738, 520-KPFT. We only have about 20 minutes left, and we only need a hundred and-

**BRUCE:** \$42.

**HOST 1:** --\$42 to get over the goal. So come on. Give us a call. 520-5738, 520-KPFT.

[MUSIC - WHITNEY HOUSTON, "I WANNA DANCE WITH SOMEBODY"]

And that was-- who was that? Whitney Houston. And don't you want to dance? Don't you want to dance? I know you want to dance because you're going to come down and enjoy the *AfterHours* dance. We're going to be sponsoring the *AfterHours* dance for you. And that's going to be part of what, Bruce?

**BRUCE:** Gay and Lesbian Pride Week.

**HOST 1:** Is that right, Terry?

**TERRY:** That's right.

**HOST 1:** Are we going to dance the night away?

**TERRY:** Dance the night away.

**HOST 1:** And not only are we going to dance the night away, but this is going to be broadcast live over KPFT radio.

**TERRY:** It's going to be wonderful.

**HOST 1:** So for four hours on June the 18th, you can join us in a celebration of life as we begin Lesbian and Gay Pride Week. Well, actually, it starts the day before.

**BRUCE:** Right.

**HOST 1:** But we'll be cooking.

**BRUCE:** But who's counting?

**HOST 1:** And it'll be great. We've got 3:40 in the morning on Sunday, KPFT Houston, 90.1 FM *AfterHours*. Michael Davis getting ready to come in and do [? Stepchild ?] 213. You need to stay tuned for that. Need to stay tuned for all of the wonderful programming that you hear on this station. And for a measly \$18 pledge, you can pick up the program guide for a year, and that'll give you information as to everything that's happening here.

**HOST 2:** We must destroy the myths once and for all, shatter them. We must continue to speak out. And most importantly-- most importantly-- every gay person must come out.

**HOST 1:** Right?

**HOST 2:** That's right.

**HOST 1:** So what's going on at Marathon Central?

**HOST 2:** And you can come out and show your support for this show and for KPFT by calling 520-5738.

**HOST 1:** 520-KPFT.

**HOST 2:** 520-KPFT.

**HOST 1:** And what's it look like?

**HOST 2:** It's been-- we had a flurry of phone calls during the last break, and we were up to \$258 still.

**HOST 1:** \$258?

**HOST 2:** Yeah, and it's kind of slowed down.

**BRUCE:** My dad dialed me yesterday afternoon.

**HOST 1:** OK, why are they tapping on the mics?

**HOST 2:** I don't know. Someone's tapping on the mics.

**HOST 1:** OK, well, Clay, you got some news for us?

**CLAY:** A little bit.

**HOST 1:** All right, what you got, baby?

**CLAY:** OK. I want everybody to come out tomorrow at 6:00 PM to Dignity Center-- Lesbian and Gay Pride Week Committee is going to have a meeting-- and get as many people involved as we can. Monday the 16th at 8:00 PM, What's It Worth Auction is going to be at Heaven, benefiting the Lesbian--

**HOST 2:** The Pride Week meeting is tonight, Sunday. Today is Sunday.

**CLAY:** I said Sunday. OK, well, back on Monday, the auction is going to be at Heaven benefiting the Lesbian and Gay Pride Week Committee. Come out and enjoy.

**HOST 1:** This is really-- damn, this is live radio, isn't it, baby?

**CLAY:** [LAUGHS]

**HOST 1:** He's trying to do his thing, and everybody's waving fingers. OK. You want to start all over? Go ahead, Clay. You're doing fine.

**CLAY:** Today, Sunday, 6:00 PM at Dignity Center, Lesbian and Gay Pride Week Committee meeting. Come out and get involved. Monday, May 16th, 8:00 PM, What's It Worth Auction at Heaven benefiting the Lesbian Gay Pride Week Committee. Monday, Gay Fathers will not be having their meeting because they will all be out supporting What's It Worth Auction.

May 21st, Saturday, civil disobedience training, 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM at 3217 Fannin. For more information, call Bruce at 961-2905. On June 1st, time to be determined, civil disobedience at the British Consulate protesting Clause 29 in England. Again, call Bruce at 961-2905 for more information.

Sunday, June 5th, Pride Week Committee meeting at Dignity, 6:00 PM. And finally, June the 11th, Saturday at 9:30 PM, Lynn Lavner will be in concert in Dallas.

**BRUCE:** Sounds good.

**CLAY:** Yeah.

**HOST 1:** Thank you, Clay. And if you want more information, you can always call the Gay and Lesbian Switchboard at 529-3211.

**TEDDY RUXPIN:** (SINGING) We've been tucked in together. The sheets are nice and--

[MUSIC PLAYING]

[SIGHS]

**HOST 1:** They're all giving me dirty looks because that's my good friend, Teddy Ruxbin, saying it's almost time to go. And I don't know why they don't--

**HOST 2:** Time to make a pit stop and go to sleep.

**HOST 1:** What?

**TERRY:** Time to make a pit stop and go to sleep.

**HOST 1:** No, he said no need to make a pit stop.

**HOST 2:** Oh. Well, I need to.

**TERRY:** Lloyd has to make a pit stop.

**HOST 1:** But I have to make a pit stop because I have to go down and play work for eight hours. [SNORES]

**BRUCE:** Yeah, they were talking about sleeping in bed. Isn't that kind of like Gene Wilder in *Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About Sex?*

**HOST 1:** No, that's something else.

**BRUCE:** Oh.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738, 520-KPFT.

**BRUCE:** We've got a pledge on the line.

**HOST 1:** We have a pledge on the line.

**TERRY:** We have a pledge on the line.

**LLOYD:** A pledge.

**HOST 2:** \$68 pledge.

**TERRY:** All right.

**HOST 1:** 1: We've got about--

**LLOYD:** Yay.

**HOST 1:** --four minutes left to go.

**BRUCE:** Every dollar counts.

**HOST 2:** We are \$74 from the goal.

**HOST 1:** Oh, come on now. Someone's got 74 big ones in their pocket.

**MIKE:** Tell them to give till it hurts.

**HOST 1:** We're talking about a dollars.

**TERRY:** [LAUGHS]

**HOST 2:** Mike says give till it hurts.

**TERRY:** Give till it hurts.

**HOST 2:** Give till it hurts.

[LAUGHTER]

**TERRY:** Now, Bruce.

**BRUCE:** 74 would hurt.

**TERRY:** Now Bruce.

[LAUGHTER]

**HOST 1:** OK, kids, it's time to go home--

**TERRY:** Oh, no.

**HOST 1:** --here in a minute.

**HOST 2:** Oh, no. It's over so soon?



**BRUCE:** Call us.

**MICHAEL:** Not till we get the \$68.

**HOST 2:** I don't want to go.

**HOST 1:** Michael says not till we get the \$68.

**MICHAEL:** \$68, you know you got it.

**HOST 1:** Oh, come on.

**TERRY:** We're having fun.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738. 520-KPFT.

**TERRY:** KPFT.

**HOST 2:** We need \$74.

**HOST 1:** We only need \$68 to make the goal, and that's going to be one way for you to support free speech in the US of A, which is what this station is all about. Not only can you hear *AfterHours*, you can hear all kinds of wonderful programs--

**HOST 2:** I've got a--

**HOST 1:** --from every aspect of--

**HOST 2:** --thank you to say.

**HOST 1:** --of our community that you can think of. What is it?

**HOST 2:** I've got a thank you to say to Jeff. He made the \$68 pledge.

**HOST 1:** All we need is--

**TERRY:** Thanks, Jeff.

**HOST 1:** --that one \$68 pledge to get us over the goal. Come on.

**HOST 2:** \$68? Let's make \$74.

**HOST 1:** We got less than three minutes.

**TERRY:** Somebody.

**HOST 1:** Less than three minutes.

And once you do, you will feel so much better. I ask people all over this country to do one thing-- come out. Come out, America. Come out.

**HOST 1:** Oh, Harvey, if you could just see us now.

[MUSIC PLAYING]

3:59 and 14 seconds. We've got less than 45 seconds to do it. How we doing out there?

**HOST 2:** I need one \$68 pledge.

**HOST 1:** One \$68 pledge.

**HOST 2:** Marco from Austin called--

**HOST 1:** From Austin.

**HOST 2:** --with a \$5 pledge.

**HOST 1:** Sounds great. Thank you, Austin.

[CHEERING]

**HOST 2:** So we need \$68.

**HOST 1:** \$68. Come on.

**HOST 2:** \$68.

**HOST 1:** 520-5738.

**HOST 2:** Just one \$68 pledge.

**HOST 1:** 520-KPFT. We're going to do it.

**BRUCE:** You can do it. You can do it.

**HOST 2:** We need you to go to your phone now.

**HOST 1:** And make that--

**HOST 2:** Pick up.

**HOST 1:** --pledge of support to KPFT and free radio. Keep us on the air. 520-5738, 520-KPFT.
