Good morning. This is the after hours report. I'm Jeff Mackey. Jack Loftus, Vice President and editor of the Houston Chronicle said Wednesday he regrets the papers running of a headline on both that day's editions and that said, he said smacks of tabloid journalism. laughed. He said, however, that he did not blame anyone on his staff for the headline, killer transsexual and run off for county cheer on a story about Leslie Perez facing Ken Benson Jr. in a run off with a post on April 10, and that he himself would take responsibility for it. Loftus did not disclose who wrote the headline. The description referred to Perez as 1961 murder conviction in the slaying of Fred Jones, a Houston insurance salesman. Jack Carter, the outgoing Democratic Party chair said he was incensed by the headline, and that he felt the use of it was an embarrassment to Houston. Carter also objected to an implied comparison in the article between this race and the party chair raise two years ago, when Claude Jones, a supporter of political extremists, Lyndon LaRouche surprised Harris County Democrats with his victory. Unlike the Jones victory, Perez is placing in the runoff did not seem to shock Democratic Party officials here Carter said Benson and Perez defeated Houston Attorney Mike Charlton, who was endorsed by both community political groups and Jones who placed a distant fourth. Jones was removed from the post 11 months after winning the election two years ago for campaigning against the Democratic Party's presidential candidate Michael Dukakis. Benson 30, nephew of US Senator Lloyd Benson has worked in statewide and congressional campaigns since 1980. He was an aide to US Representative Ron Coleman of El Paso. Perez is president of the Houston chapters of AIDS coalition to unleash power and the Gay Lesbian Democrats of America. She has been active in party politics for several years. The Fifth District Court of Appeals has declined to grant a new trial for the man who was convicted in the slant of two gay men in the Dallas Park. The

conviction and 30 year prison term given to Richard Bednarski led to remarks by district judge Jack Hampton, that he didn't give Bednarski the maximum sentence of life in prison because the victims were gay people. Defense Lawyer Kevin Clancy claim Bednarski should have been granted a mistrial and eventually a new trial because one of the jurors told his fellow jurors that he had visited the scene of the sling to take some measurements while the jury was deadlocked. Appeals Court justices Monday, March 5 denied the claim and noted that the jurors passing remark that he had visited the crime scene did not count as new evidence. The court noted that the juror did not say what he did or saw at the park and was immediately admonished by other jurors not to discuss the incident further. The defense also argued that one of the victims had told police just before he died that his assailant was stocky, and this description did not fit Bednarski. The justices noted that other evidence pointed to Bednarski and said the addition of the word stuck to the man's description of the assailant did not shake their confidence in the guilty verdict. Several witnesses who attended North mesquite High School testified that Bednarski a student at Richardson Community College was the only one armed When a group of teenagers went to Riverstone Park to harass gay men, Bednarski testified that his former classmates life. Plans have just been formalized for the lambda program, the first program for inpatient and outpatient alcohol and drug abuse and psychiatric issues targeted to the gay and lesbian community in Texas. The program began accepting its first patients last Thursday, March 15, announced Sharon Stone of Sharon Stone and Associates. The lambda program, founded and directed by stone is unique in Texas, but is patterned after similar programs in other parts of the United States such as the pride Institute. To our knowledge, the new lambda program is one of only two or three like in the nation in Texas can boast of being counted among the select few localities. Stone said she knocked on the doors of almost every hospital in Houston, and at every turn, she met with resistance to implementing her new program. She said obstacles of all shapes and sizes were continually thrown in my path I've heard every excuse from we don't want this to be known as a gay hospital to treat everyone as if they are mainstream. But in the end with persistent stone eventually succeeded. This program is not for mainstream stone explained it's a specialized treatment program for people who have to deal with not only with addictions and psychiatric issues, but those of acceptance not only with the general population, but often with their immediate families. CASA, a special hospital recently received a grant from the Texas Department of Health for \$86,060 to care for uninsured HIV AIDS patients reported this spokesperson Gretchen Thorpe, the grant will be utilized to provide sub acute and hospice care to patients on an interim short term basis, usually seven to 21 days. admission criteria stipulate that the individual have no other mechanism available to reimburse care. In addition, patients must be able to obtain pharmaceutical services through outside resources such as a hospital district, gold referring agency or private pay basis. CASA is a very unique facility licensed by the Texas Department of Health as a special hospital. Patients transferred to Casa are admitted to fully furnished units. Nurses are on duty 24 hours a day to provide for the patient's needs and to offer support to friends and family. Services are rendered at approximately half the cost of the acute care setting. The staff of CASA is pleased to have the opportunity to
