Stay in in a closet, suicide. And then one day that child might open a paper it says homosexual elected in San Francisco and there are two options. One option is to go to California they in San Antonio one night, two days after I was elected, I got a phone call. The voice was quite young was from Altoona, Pennsylvania. And the person said, thanks. And you've got to let gay people so that that young child and the 1000s upon 1000s Like that child know that there's hope for a

better world is hope for a better tomorrow without hope that only gays that those blocks the Asian disabled seniors the essence essence without hope the essence give up. I know that you cannot live on hope alone. Without it, life is not worth living. And you you you gotta get home.
