I had to go to New York to go to events. I used to go to a place called dressing for pleasure in New York, which was an incredible event that happened once a year. And at that stage in, I guess that started about 1819 86. They had 10 years of that, and those of us in the middle part of the United States, where we did not have a Yulan Spiegel or a Janus like they have out on the West Coast. Ulan speedos on the East Coast, right? We didn't have anything like that. So once a year going to New York was the big thing. We then started a club here in town called Houston pet guy named Robert Dante who was here for the Houston s&m ball really founded that in the very early 1990s. Maybe 1990 itself or 1991 started a little house over on bend the most of the people that came to it, found out about it off of a what we now call live chat channels, but they used to call a BBS is your idea. Well, there was an old BBs service called Houston chat channel, HCC and you would get on and type on your old 1200 baud modem. And we would meet for lunch it was every Wednesday and then we would once a month or so they would have meetings at some restaurant. And for we started pet then or when Dante started peppering a few others. There was most of those people came to it. And we met over at a little place on Montrose near Westheimer. There was Charlie's diner. And Charlie's diner should have a plaque. It's been a long time. But Charlie's diner, God bless. It was just the greatest place. You could do anything. I mean, if you wanted to see transgenders at three o'clock in the morning, that's where you went. You know, it was the place that you know to get a good steak or good hamburger. And look at really strange, weird perverted people. Getting to Eau de let me tell you, it's easy to find strange, weird perverted people now. We used to have to look for but we found him at Charlie's

It was this little small All thing. And we ran an ad and these people would see it and they would come look at us and they would never come back. Because we were as bad as they were afraid we were. And we used to talk about how we could build a community where the little couple from a leaf wasn't afraid of us. And I think we've done that we've got about 1000 of those little couples from Melee that come to these events on quite a regular basis. And Max, you've met a number, right? But that's how it started. It was a long, slow haul for a while.

And everybody else was so grateful that I showed up with pizza that they didn't care that they've been working for 14 hours. And I hadn't done a damn thing. But I got all the credit. And so they people would put huge tarps all the way around this gigantic warehouse. And there was absolutely no air conditioning and no heating. So we just were miserable in the summer and we were miserable in the winter. But you know what? We were doing S&M in a big place. And it was just incredible for us because we weren't used to it. So that was one place that we started. So we got kind of a tradition of the big warehouse parties that H pep would throw. And then some other O's kind of began building our houses out to where we could add parties. I will never forget the first party I ever threw was in 1991. I invited every person in the state of Texas that I knew there was into S&M. I hired a concert pianist. And they were playing on my grand piano. We had all 21 people that I knew. And I knew a lot. I mean, that was the that was the Texas community as I know a lot of them were that from that dressing for pleasure event. And we tried to be as European sophisticated as we could be. And we dressed in our leather and our latex. And when people walked in, I had a naked girl hanging from a beam and my den, concert pianist playing on my grand piano fireplace roaring fire behind this naked girl. And somebody was hitting her with something. And we had candlelight all around. And everybody that came had to bring the best food they could possibly bring. And we had music and food and S&M and 21 people thought it was the greatest night of their life. I mean, it was really something special. From that. The came the idea of house parties. And most cities have some dungeon you can go to Houston is a house party town.

And in the old days when there weren't a lot of other cities and towns that had great S&M organizations, people would come to every peop party from Dallas and San Antonio, and even New Orleans and Austin. And the parties were an event.

Kind of hard to do that now. Because we're just we're pretty commonplace. You know, I mean, every CSI show has something about kink on it. Now. There's some somebody getting killed through s&m One way on some TV show every week now. So yeah, it's definitely it's

That was a major happening in Texas s&m And especially Houston. Part of the reason for that there have been some large forces that brought about the growth of Houston s&m Just like the same forces brought about are some one of the forces brought about growth all over the country, which is the internet of course, right. But up until 95 That that hadn't been the tremendous impact that it is now. And in the first week of December 1995. We had an H pep meeting. We had 35 people show up. We had the ball, the Houston acid and ball that took place at Tantra that month. And we had so many newcomers come to the very next meeting because they had gone to the ball. We had about 125 people show up at the next Houston pet meeting. Most of those brand new people that only learned about us as a result of the ball, so that the s&m ball that began then we had to a year for awhile, brought in lots of people from all over the country eventually, but especially people from Houston, they would find out about the different clubs at the Houston epsilon ball. And they would come they would come to pep and then from PEP, which was kind of like if you think of the wheel, Pep was the, the hub of the wheel of s&m groups in Houston. With the other clubs, everybody was kind of a member of Houston Pep. And then you had these other clubs that were like a spoke. The next club that came about was arrows. And then in 1997,
