So we're talking it still at a time when the AIDS was still kind of in its infancy. It wasn't really mentioned, it wasn't pronounced. There wasn't as talked about. And that's the type of this unfortunately, the generation that's coming up now is that they're figured, what what the hell am I got to lose, and I just dropped my pen. But that's that's an unfortunate part of where we're going at with this, especially when also when you hear news that the deaths from aids have dropped 42% from 9096 to 97. But that the amount of people who have been dying from it, that number has decreased, is now only 20% of a decrease from 97 to 98. And one of the things I highlighted the young men survey a seven cities study conducted by the CDC interviewed almost 3500 men between 15 and 22. Who said they have sex with other men. The study found that 41% of young gay men said they had unprotected anal sex in the last six months, while only presented
