Thank you very good. It's a pleasure to be with you this evening and to share some of my thoughts about why the Equal Rights Amendment is detrimental to America. So that we know what we're talking about. I think it's always good to read the amendment. A lot of people think that the Equal Rights Amendment is quite lengthy, and not the very short amendment that it is. Second one simply says the quality of life under the law shall not be denied by the United States or about any state on account. Testing the Congress so half the time looking for legislation, the provisions of this section pretty safe. This amendment, so take a pass please, years after date of ratification. These will have been one of the most debated and perhaps one of the most misunderstood amendments that's ever been proposed to the United States Constitution and opposing the amendment. We are not against the equal opportunity for all. We believe in the role of individual choice. And we do not do government mandating rules and regulations over our individual. We feel we're perfectly capable of making these individual decisions about our loved. One is it that level of because it does not allow any legal distinction, under any circumstance, between male and female, we believe that male and female should be legally treated differently. Equal Rights Amendment, if passed, would take away the legal power from the homemaker. She would be responsible for home support, plus tax support of the family. Because if it were any other way, it would be taking a greater responsibility on the law or the man determination. So it would be impossible to maintain laws that was safe that the father was primarily responsible for supporting the family. Whenever I read the Equal Rights Amendment is not a women. I mean, man, woman, boy, girl. So there's nothing about the Equal Rights Amendment that states that it is a women's rights amendment. It is an amendment to eliminate and under every situation in every position, legislatively and legally. At the time, the Equal Rights Amendment was debated in the National Congress was concerned with the vagueness of the Equal Rights Amendment. So he proposed amendment amendments are a new way back this is the first amendment that's ever been proposed. But if we've gotten into the debate on this amendment, and the proponents will agree that there are already existing laws to guarantee equal pay for equal work, there's a 1964 Civil Rights Act and that means 72 Equal Opportunity any people who go through the run would not get an automatic rate, they still have to go through the same procedures that they can permanently

go under the EEOC to an Equal Rights Amendment is the most dangerous, because it states that the Congress don't have the power to enforce by appropriate legislation. This is a massive transfer of power from state and local governments to the federal government. All legislation that affects an individual citizen, that includes standing on the board has been inherited survivors, benefits, insurance rates, prison regulation, for protect the labor. Power to the federal government away from the state and local governments. We will see amending the way representatives determine we have no one in this country.
