It's hard to know how many people didn't kill someone because they feared the death penalty. But regardless of the answer to the above, it must certainly deterred that person. And please don't say life in prison will ensure the person doesn't kill again. Well, it's true. I absolutely have too many men die in here for that, even on a friendly unit. My, my personal experience with the death with some with the death penalty case and all that is this part I am. Back in the late 60s, some man named Kenneth Allen Macduff went and killed three teenagers in North Central Texas, stole their car went and robbed a bank found guilty, sentenced to death. The Supreme Court in the early 70s commuted said the death penalty under all circumstances was unconstitutional. And everything reverted back to the next highest penalty, which in the state of Texas at that time was life imprisonment, with the possibility of parole. So Kenneth Allen McDonoughs sentence was commuted to life in prison with the possibility of parole. Along came the late 80s, when there was a lot of prison overcrowding, and they had to start releasing people. The pardons parole board looked at this guy's folder and they said, Hey, he served 20 years for for murder. Let's let him out. He was released from prison and received a full college education was sent to college by the taxpayers. How did that happen? Because he killed three teenagers and robbed a bank who stole their car. He deserved a free college education.
