Okay, 168 hours, they're out there, broadcasting all sorts of stuff. Not just the gay and lesbian, to the Creole to the blues. Wonderful. I mean, this program. I mean, I've that's one of the things I love about KPFT. Because when I wake up in the morning, and my radio still stuck on Jimmy, when I wake up in the morning, I've got the blues, yeah, but it's a good blues. Oh, yeah. Not not the blues there because, well, a little bit of blues. Were missing Jimmy there. But

And he wasn't he didn't as far as I know. I don't know, my No, my grandfather was with the US forces during World War Two. But that is something that the triangle needs a little something more to me. And being being Polish and being gay, that that that is a part of my heritage. That yes, some of my, my ancestors, countrymen died a lot in that. And to put it this way, when I first first time I saw Schindler's List with my father. He goes, that's our heritage, those were our people. What do you think of it and I go, Well, they're missing something. Because if two thirds of the people were Jewish, that were killed, and 1/3 was was other will who were triangles. I didn't see a triangle. Whether it was pink or green, or purple, or as some say the black ones that were they can't confirm whether or not they're lesbians. We missed that we miss some of that heritage that we miss some of that. And that's why I'm so proud with this is going to be my first Pride Parade coming up, that I'm going to be standing on the sidelines Oh, and and not only just being being there, watching it, but at least going up saying I know that person Okay, I know the One in each year.
