And so there really are no funds to study at all, to fund health care to fund the dental dams that we hand out in our program, actually, we have to kind of be sneaky and take them out of our condom budget, we're not actually funded to do lesbian outreach, and it's just we have to kind of stretch the condom budget to do that. And it's not going to be until, you know, gay and

bisexual women decide that, you know, they really need to have that kind of attention focused on them. Because the numbers are growing. And even if it's not HIV, it's STDs, you know, sure, well,
