Excuse me, I'm laughing because that's what Jimmy would do if you were here. I was pulling into a local establishment downtown. And I heard Deborah read something from the Houston Chronicle. Tuesday, May the 22nd, talking about Jim Henson. And of course we all know that he passed away last week he died of pneumonia, I believe it was, but the headline says, street kids say bye to Jim Henson, and it's written by Greg Smith from the Hearst news service. It says under the majestic arches of St. John the Divine Catholic Church, to the large yellow bird wearing a green ribbon and singing a song that his friend, a famous frog used to perform. Kermit the Frog was conspicuous by his absence. But everyone knew his song. It's not easy being green. The song provided the most emotional moment at Monday's memorial service for Jim Henson, who invented Kermit the Frog and Big Bird and the rest of the empire that made them up. It's a familiar word to millions of people and over 100 countries. Ensign who educate educated children throughout the world with this Sesame Street TV show and created the Muppet Show for TV and veiny Muppet adventures and three movies died unexpectedly of pneumonia last week. He was 53. Fans nearly filled the Cathedral, which holds 5000 people for a service that seem less a funeral than a celebration of living. As Jim Henson wanted it. Warner's avoided blacks and wore the reds, greens, blues and yellows of a sunny day. In fact, the organist began the service with a rendition of sunny day, the theme song of Sesame Street. The Dirty Dozen brass band played when the Saints Come Marching in, and 1000s of mourners waive plastic butterflies on sticks. Most of them up at voices made appearances. Miss Piggy, Fozzie the bear birth of Sesame Street's Burton, Ernie, Kermit and Ernie didn't make the service though, because Jim Henson had provided their voices. But fans did hear a recording of Henson and Kermit singing rainbow connection from the Muppet Movie. Comments presence was everywhere from the green ribbons on every chair to puppeteers hunts. Kermit green shirt. Jim Henson's Muppets spoke to the part of child and all of us that was grown up in the part of the grown up that was a child. And this service his friend said, allowed us all to breathe in Jim Henson's air one more time. His manager said in a business where you usually have to shout to get attention. Jim Henson never spoke above a whisper. And that whisper will stay with us for a long, long time. Frank Oz the voice of characters Miss Piggy and Burt also spoke. Quote, looking out, I only realize how large a man he was. This man I worked with and played with then he broke into tears and walked away. The program for the service contained a quote from Jim Henson quote, please watch out for each other and love and forgive everybody. It's a good life. Enjoy it and of course, if you listen to this program, you know it's not easy being gay. So one more time Jim Henson we're gonna miss you
