Coming out of the this week's edition of The Houston voice are reporting that the probe is targeting alleged fraud at a local AIDS clinic here in Houston. Supporters of the Thomas Street Clinic are pressing officials to reopen a popular volunteer program that has fallen victim to an ongoing investigation. According to the Houston voice, local and federal probe into a local and federal probe into alleged prescription fraud F autonomous Fleet Street Clinic has indefinitely shut down the popular volunteer

program there and raise concerns about heavy handed investigation at that clinic. A tip from a clinic employee in December launched the investigation which has resulted in the arrest of a former volunteer with the People with AIDS coalition and temporary closing of the coalition's volunteer and child care programs at the sprawling AIDS clinic in near Northside in Houston Fourth Ward. Authorities allege that Alvin Joseph Pullman 37 years old fraudulently obtained drug from a South Main Street pharmacy using the names the clinics name and Medical Director on several prescription mostly for steroid like substances according to the Houston Police Department. The police investigators investigated and in December, they investigated in December and on January 14, Pullman was arrested. This is an ongoing investigation. Right now many of the volunteers stuff is being done by the staffing, Thomas Street Clinic however their childcare program is unable to continue right now. Because it just is not enough staffers. The volunteers segment of it has been shut down temporarily. And we will keep you up to date and well informed on further developments in this case.
